Recycling Requirements for Residential Properties in the City of San Diego

City of San Diego Recycling Ordinance

All residential properties must subscribe to recycling and organic waste recycling service. To comply, the responsible person (the individual or entity responsible for the management of solid waste for disposal or recycling) for the residential property must provide all of the following.

External Containers and Collection Service	 Contract with one franchise waste hauler to service trash, recycling and organic waste recycling. Recycling and organic waste collection must be as frequent as necessary to meet demand, but recycling must be collected at least once every other week and organic waste recycling at least once a week. Ensure all external containers are leak-proof, rodent-proof and outfitted with close-fitting lids. Place external recycling and organic waste recycling containers in a convenient location next to or as close as possible to each trash container or disposal area. Submit proper documentation with the Alternative Service Verification Form (ASVA) to the Environmental Services Department if a residential property self-hauls, back-hauls or uses a Certified Recyclable Material Collector. PLEASE NOTE: Self-hauling and back-hauling does not exempt multifamily properties from the requirement of contracting with one franchise hauler to provide trash, recycling and organic waste recycling service.
Containers Not Pending Final Collection	 Pair a recycling container with every trash container (except for restrooms). Place organic waste recycling containers where organic waste (such as food scraps and yard trimmings) is generated and pair them with a trash and recycling container. It is advised that all containers are color-coded in accordance with the Container and Signage Guidelines and are of adequate size to accommodate the materials generated.
Signage	 Place signage on all recycling and organic waste recycling containers, storage areas and enclosures to clearly identify them as recycling containers. A list and/or images of acceptable recyclable and organic waste recyclable materials must also be displayed on or near containers. Signage on outdoor recycling and organic waste recycling containers for pick up collection must include the name and phone number of the certified hauler.
Education and Training	 Provide education to tenants, employees and contractors regarding acceptable materials for collection, container location(s), recycling and organic waste recycling requirements and the residential property's responsibility to recycle. The education should take place annually, upon occupancy or when there are changes to the recycling program. Prohibit container contamination (the placing of recyclable materials in a container not designated to receive those recyclables). Containers shall be checked periodically and tenants, employees and contractors shall be informed if containers are contaminated.

Residential properties must collect the following recyclables in designated recycling containers.

Check with your franchise hauler to determine what materials are accepted at your property.

COMPLIANCE MONITORING AND ENFORCEMENT

The goal of the City Recycling Ordinance is to protect the environment and the public health and safety of all San Diegans. To achieve these goals, Code Compliance Officers (CCOs) routinely visit residential properties. CCOs are authorized to issue written notices and citations for properties unwilling to comply.
