BOARD MEETING ACCESS AND PUBLIC COMMENT DURING COVID-19

Until further notice, the Commission on the Status of Women meeting will be conducted pursuant to the provision of California Government Code section 54953(e), as amended by Assembly Bill 361, which allows the Commission on the Status of Women to use teleconferencing and to provide the public an opportunity to address the Commission on the Status of Women via a call-in option or an internet-based service option, during a proclaimed state of emergency. On November 15, 2022, the San Diego City Council made findings under amended Assembly Bill 361 which apply to all boards, commissions, and committees of the City of San Diego. Members of the public in attendance at the Commission on the Status of Women meetings are encouraged to maintain social distancing. Additionally, we are continuing to provide alternatives to in-person attendance for participating in Commission on the Status of Women

HOW TO SPEAK TO A PARTICULAR ITEM OR DURING NON-AGENDA PUBLIC COMMENT:

VIA VIRTUAL PLATFORM

When the Chair introduces the item you would like to comment on (or indicates it is time for Non-Agenda Public Comment), raise your hand by either tapping the “Raise Your Hand” button on your computer, tablet, or Smartphone, or by dialing *9 on your phone. You will be taken in the order in which you raised your hand. You may only speak once on a particular item. When the Chair indicates it is your turn to speak, click the unmute prompt that will appear on your computer, tablet or Smartphone, or dial *6 on your phone.

WRITTEN COMMENT

Webform: Comment on Agenda items and Non-Agenda Public Comment may be submitted using the webform indicating the agenda item number for which you wish to submit your comment. Comments received by 11:00 AM the day of the meeting will be distributed to the Commission on the Status of Women and posted online with the meeting materials. All webform comments are limited to 200 words. Comments received after the deadlines described above but before the item is called will be submitted into written record for the relevant item. Please go to the Commission on the Status of Women website for further instructions. Written Materials: Instead of submitting written materials as an attachment to the webform, you may submit via U.S. Mail to Attn: Boards and Commissions/Commission on the Status of Women, 202 C Street, 11th Floor, San Diego, CA 92101. Materials submitted via U.S. Mail must be received the business day prior to the meeting to be distributed to the Commission on the Status of Women.
