# NEWS FROM COUNCILMEMBER CHRIS WARD

Dear Neighbors:

Throughout most of May, the City Council will be holding hearings to examine the Mayor's proposed budget for the 2018 Fiscal Year. We'll be going through the proposals in detail, one department at a time, to examine projections and service levels for the upcoming year.

At first glance, the Mayor's proposed \$3.5B City budget maintains public safety and neighborhood services at current levels, which is critical given the projected shortfall the City is facing in the upcoming year. However, the proposal would also eliminate nearly 60 General Fund positions, and make unacceptably deep cuts to our arts and culture programs which will need to be addressed as we examine the city's spending priorities.

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## Homelessness Update

This month, the Regional Task Force on the Homeless released the results of its annual Point in Time Count. These numbers provide us an important snapshot of the region from January, and confirm what many of us have seen in our communities in the last year - we're facing a major increase in the number of homeless on our streets, driving a crisis that demands an immediate, comprehensive response. As we further analyze this information, we'll be better able to target our efforts and dollars to provide the full range of necessary services for individuals who need help to get back on their feet.

We've seen important progress from the Mayor and regional leaders, and now with the creation of a new Select Committee on the Homeless the City Council can use this new data and experiences from recent

years to drive policy solutions to accelerate our progress on finally addressing homelessness.
