Rebuilding San Diego: District 5 Road Repairs



As we continue to rebuild San Diego, the long-awaited resurfacing of the east side of Rancho Bernardo Road is nearly complete. The east- and west-bound lanes from Bernardo Center Drive to Summerfield Lane are being repaved with most of the work occurring between 9 p.m. and 5 a.m. In addition, the stretch of Paseo Lucido in front of Rancho Bernardo High School is slated for this summer. Over the next several months, we ask for your continued patience with traffic impacts in the area.

In the San Pasqual Valley, the most northeastern part of the City of San Diego, newly resurfaced roads include Old Milky Way and portions of San Pasqual Road. Prior to this work, these roads had been neglected for decades, to the chagrin of both residents and tourists visiting the San Diego Zoo Safari Park.

Other District 5 roads that have been recently repaved include:

- Spring Canyon Road and Normanton Way in Scripps Ranch
- Lewiston Street and Lindamere Lane in Carmel Mountain Ranch
- Samantha Ave and Ellingham Street in Rancho Peñasquitos

The Fiscal Year 2019 budget, which began on July 1, ensures the momentum to rebuild San Diego does not slow down. The FY19 budget allocates \$76 million in funding to fix the equivalent of 390 miles of streets, and I'll continue to advocate for more District 5 roads to get the repairs they need.

Ready, Set, Go! Fire Safety

I've heard from many residents about the closure of the Carmel Mountain Ranch Golf Course, and I share their disappointment with the owner's decision to close. However, given that it is a private property and business, the City could not prevent them from closing. My office is currently working with community leaders to identify options going forward.

Any future redevelopment plans for the site would have to go through an extensive public process, during which the community will have an opportunity to weigh in. To avoid having to recuse myself from a future Council vote, I cannot take a position on any speculative redevelopment but will always be open to your input and concerns.

To be reinstated by the City, the Carmel Mountain Ranch Planning Board is in need of new board members to serve a minimum one-year commitment.
