# Keeping Up the Momentum to Rebuild San Diego





The month of May is budget season for the City of San Diego, and the City Council is in the process of reviewing Mayor Kevin Faulconer's proposed budget for Fiscal Year 2019, which begins on July 1.

The proposed \$3.8 billion Citywide budget ensures our focus on infrastructure does not lose momentum. It outlines a \$633 million infrastructure investment, the largest in City history. Within that capital program is the Infrastructure Fund created by Prop H, the Rebuild San Diego initiative that I authored and voters overwhelmingly approved in 2016. Rebuild San Diego provides sustained investment in our neighborhoods, even in lean budget years like this one.

With the help of Prop H funds, City crews are on pace to surpass the Mayor's goal of 1,000 miles of road repairs in five years. One highlight is the <u>recent repaying of Rancho Carmel Drive</u> in District 5. There is more work to be done, and I will continue to advocate for District 5 roads.

Other FY19 proposed budget highlights include:

- The highest level of library and recreation center operating hours in a decade
- The largest recruitment and retention package for officers in SDPD history
- Investment in technologies like Get It Done San Diego, to improve customer service, cultivate civic engagement, and operate with greater levels of accountability and transparency

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### Street Events & Activities Search- Citizen View



City of San Diego staff is utilizing a new tool called Street Events & Activities Search (SEAS) to plan and coordinate projects throughout the City. Its Citizen View application enables you to access useful information regarding work in the City's rights-of-way and at public facilities. One example in Scripps Ranch is the Miramar Clearwell Improvement Project; SEAS Citizen View lists where the improvements will take place, an estimated timeline, its status and other details. Another example of information found on SEAS Citizen View is special event permits throughout the City, like the RB Alive! Street Fair and the SRCA Fourth of July Parade permits.

Our goal is to make San Diego's government as innovative as the people it represents. Through the City's Open Data Policy, which I drafted in 2013 with the help of local tech experts, the City of San Diego's data is more accessible to the people of San Diego. I am committed to making the City's data available online in searchable formats with tools like SEAS Citizen View, where the public can easily access it.
