
Expanded 'Get It Done' Services

The 'Get It Done' platform, which I'm proud to have led the effort to develop, has recently been expanded again, allowing residents to engage with City Hall in easier, more accessible ways.

In addition to reporting potholes, graffiti and broken street lights, residents are now able to report:

- Illegal parking
- Violation of the City's oversized vehicle ordinance
- Scavenging
- Missed trash pick-ups
- Hazardous materials issues
- Exposed electrical wires

Residents can also use 'Get It Done' to make appointments to obtain or renew a passport.

Community Vision: The Rolling Hills Neighborhood Park








It was my honor to join Mayor Kevin Faulconer and the Palkovic family to break ground on significant improvements to the Rolling Hills Neighborhood Park in Rancho Peñasquitos. The groundbreaking ceremony celebrated an important milestone in the project for many in the community, particularly the Palkovic family whose 16-month-old daughter, Sienna, loved playing in the park before she passed away in 2012.

Sienna's mother, Jennifer Palkovic, spearheaded Sienna's PlayGarden Community Project as its chair and raised more than \$250,000 from local businesses, community members and the City and County. I'm proud to have contributed \$21,000 in savings from my office budget to the project and celebrate the great partnership between this community and the City. Built in 1978, this will be the first time the park has received upgrades and enhancements since the installation of original playground equipment in 1986.
