

San Diego, California, December 5, 1913.

To the Honorable Common Council  
of the City of San Diego.

Mr. President and Gentlemen:

Document No. 70438 has been referred to the City Attorney's office by your Honorable body, under date of December 3, 1913, same being a petition by the Board of Park Commissioners requesting the City Council to give the name "Balboa Park" to the 1400 acre city park.

I beg leave to call the attention of your Honorable body to Chapter 286 of the Statutes and Amendments to the Codes of California of 1911, being an act granting to the Board of Park Commissioners of this City the right to authorize the use of the city park for exposition purposes, and in particular to Section 3 of said chapter, which is as follows:

"Section 3. This Act shall not apply to any park lands owned by the City of San Diego other than Pueblo Lots 1129, 1130, 1131, 1135, 1136, 1137, 1142 and a portion of Pueblo Lot 1144, according to the official survey of the City of San Diego by Charles H. Poole, made in 1856, which Pueblo Lots are now and shall hereafter be known and designated as "Balboa Park' ".

It appears that the Legislature has in the above section accomplished the object sought by Document No. 70438, and that any action on the part of the City Council is now unnecessary.
