

PARKS FOR ALL OF US

While the City's current park system has resulted in many beautiful and enjoyable parks for some, it has also resulted in disinvestments for many. The lack of funding tools and land constraints have widened park shortfalls, resulting in park inequities, particularly for Communities of Concern. "Parks For All Of Us" is comprised of 4 park planning initiatives which support the City of San Diego's vision to achieve the shared goals of equity, access, conservation, and sustainability, with safe and enjoyable Parks for All of Us.

WHAT INITIATIVES ARE INCLUDED IN "PARKS FOR ALL OF US"?



Adoption of the Parks Master Plan – The Parks Master Plan will align park planning with the City's climate, equity, conservation, and housing goals. Additionally, the new park standard will result in more parks sooner, with the types of parks driven by the needs of the community based on public input



Update to the City's General Plan – These updates will enable the City to achieve the vision set by the 2008 General Plan Recreation Element



Designation of Chollas Creek Watershed as a Regional Park – A long overdue designation of the Chollas Creek Watershed as a regional park would expand park space available to residents in Communities of Concern, increase funding opportunities, and protect our natural resources



Citywide Park Development Fee – Transition to a standardized Citywide fee to allow for prioritized investment in communities with the greatest needs and allowing for the more streamlined delivery of Parks for All of Us

"PARKS FOR ALL OF US" HIGHLIGHTS

- › A strengthened commitment to acquiring new park space by setting a goal to create an additional 100 acres of developed parkland over the next 10 years
- › The Parks Master Plan establishes that all residents should be able to reach a park within a safe and enjoyable 10-minute walk from where they live
- › Park projects will be determined based on community input based on the needs of today's residents, and this process will be significantly streamlined (e.g., no Community Plan or Financing Plan amendment required)
- › The Parks Master Plan calls for the creation of a Citywide Trails Master Plan to guide trail development and protect open space
- › 50% of total Citywide Development Impact Fees collected will be invested in Communities of Concern
