Prairie Style – Recommending Designation

- Horizontal massing
- Two-story central bay with single-story wings
- Prominent flat roof with overhanging eaves at the second-story
- Full-width front porch with wood trellis

- Symmetrical primary façade
- Stucco cladding
- Brick chimney
- Original wood fenestration and doors

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Criterion D

Master Architect William Sterling Hebbard – Recommending Designation

- Retains integrity from its circa 1912 design
- Representative of a notable work of William Sterling Hebbard
 - Specifically, the resource is a good example of his solo work in the Prairie style featuring divided lite windows, full-width porch, stucco cladding, and wide eaves.
