The 3roots project Proposes a Community Plan Amendment, Municipal Code Amendment, Rezone, Public Service Easement Vacation, Vesting Tentative Map, Conditional Use Permit, Site Development Permit, Neighborhood Development Permit and Amendment to CUP No. 89-0585 for the subdivision and development for1,800 residential units (530 single family residential dwelling units and 1,270 multi-family residential dwelling units) and a mixed-use urban core consisting of approximately 160,166 square feet of retail/commercial, mixed residential/commercial developments and a 1.5-acre Mobility Hub. Additionally, the Project will include 256-acres of parks, trails, and open space along with new roads with curb, gutters, sidewalks; water, sewer, gas and electric utilities; and the restoration of Carroll Canyon Creek on vacant land and a non-operational quarry site located at 10207 Camino Santa Fe, south of Dancy Road and Baker Road, east of Camino Santa Fe, west of Trade Place and North of Trade Street.
