Beyond the Building: Challenges and Opportunities in Evaluating Recent Past Resources

"This conference panel session will use case studies to address the challenges and opportunities regarding the documentation and evaluation of properties from the recent past. Issues to be explored may include 1) applying lower thresholds of integrity to properties associated with people and events; 2) evaluating buildings and sites associated with people who may still living (on the one hand sufficient time has not passed to evaluate their contributions to history but on the other hand there is an opportunity to conduct oral histories); 3) assessing significance of late modern architecture and events without the benefit of sufficient/existing scholarship; and 4) evaluating buildings when the architectural design is secondary (developing an argument for significance if events/people are associated with "ordinary" buildings or sites). Potential case studies may include evaluating San Francisco's Civic Center for the role it played in various 1960-1970s demonstrations and protests, protecting sites identified in the San Francisco LGBTQ survey, documenting the Chicano Moratorium in Los Angeles, and documenting sites associated with the Black Panther Party in Oakland. Relevant case studies related to rural sites will also be considered."
