

Criterion A

Staff is not recommending designation under HRB Criterion A.



Criterion B

Margaret Curtis - Not Recommending

- Lived at the property from the date of construction in 1912 until 1952
- Worked with the Women's Alliance of the Unitarian Church, board member of the Neighborhood House and other social work and welfare organizations
- Does not rise to the level of significance at the local, state or national level



Criterion C

Tudor Revival style - Recommending Designation

- Constructed in 1912
- One and half stories with a gable roof and triangular knee braces
- Exterior sheathed with wood shingles
- Wood multi-light double hung, casement and fixed windows
- Centrally located porch supported by brick columns below gable roof dormer



Criterion D

Proposed Master Architect Robert R. Curtis-Recommending Designation

- House was built early in his career and reflects his early residential work
- Partnered with Theodore Kistner and built thriving offices in San Diego and Los Angeles
- Well-known architect of schools and institutional buildings



Staff Recommendation

Designate the Robert R. Curtis House located at 1435 Grove Street as a historical resource with a period of significance of 1912 under HRB Criteria C and D.

The designation excludes a rear patio enclosure, rear addition and a garage.
