The La Jolla Historical Society concurs with the conclusions stated in the references, and enthusiastically supports the designation of the Anna R. Dyble House located at 7747 Ivanhoe Avenue East in La Jolla under Criterion C as distinguished architecture in the Spanish Colonial Revival style.

This home was built during the 1920s decade of growth and change for La Jolla, a transitional period of innovative homeowners and designers that would shape the architectural sensibility of the community for decades to come. Beach cottages gave way to the work of architects who adapted historic styles to modern sensibilities, creating uniquely regional designs in Mediterranean and European architectural vocabularies. Like their neighbors in Los Angeles, Santa Barbara, and Pasadena, many La Jolla residents were influenced by the Spanish Colonial Revival style that evoked the region's culture and history. The Anna R. Dyble House is a high-integrity example of the Spanish Colonial Revival style that was popular in Southern California during this period, and especially in San Diego after the 1915 Panama-California Exposition in Balboa Park.

We commend homeowners Steven and Francesca Petroski for their stewardship of this important historic property.
