City Offers Free Training for Development Professionals

POTENTIAL TIME AND MONEY SAVINGS WITH CERTIFICATION

SAN DIEGO – If you are planning to build in the City of San Diego, a free training may help you save time and money. The City of San Diego Development Services Department (DSD) is seeking development professionals to participate in a free training that allows qualified individuals to certify that their discretionary development project applications meet the minimum Land Development Code submittal requirements, and thus are complete and ready for staff review upon initial submittal.

- WHAT:** Professional Certification Training for Discretionary Completeness Review

Note: This specific Self-Certification for Discretionary Completeness is ONLY for the entitlement process, NOT ministerial building permits.
- WHO:** Eligible certified professionals
- WHEN:** Thursday, June 1, 2017, 10 to 11 a.m.
- WHERE:** City of San Diego, Development Services Department

- WHY:** DSD staff provides this training for professionals wishing to learn more about development project completeness reviews. Professionals who become certified can reduce initial discretionary project application processing times by up to 10 business days. This saves

valuable time and money when processing land use entitlements, conditional use permits and mapping actions. Typically, these trainings are designed for architects and engineers who are licensed, but the workshop is open to any professional in the construction industry.

Over 100 development professionals including architects, engineers, attorneys and more have taken the Professional Certification for Completeness Review Course at Development Services over the past two years.
