It's amazing that eight months have passed since I was sworn into office. Fiscally Responsible Neighborhood Improvements

Myrtle Way

The curve of Myrtle Way near Balboa Park has been improved by the removal of a chain link fence and the restored accessibility of the sidewalk there. You may recall that the historic pergola that once graced the area was destroyed by a storm many years ago. Since then, local residents, visitors and users of the popular path below have had to live with an unsightly chain link fence that protruded onto the sidewalk.

The City planned to rebuild the pergola for an astronomical \$550,000. Considering the financial straits we're in and the long deferred maintenance list of needs in Balboa Park, I found such an expenditure unacceptable. After using approximately \$11,000 to clear the site, add the new fence and install a new irrigation system, I asked that the remainder of the \$550,000 allocation be used to repair the badly damaged Museum of Man dome, which will protect the museum's priceless collection and was therefore a higher priority. While I hope a pergola will one day return to the site, I am pleased that the neighborhood character has been restored and the site remains safe. The neighbors along Myrtle Way have been instrumental in these changes, and I appreciate their continued partnership.

Through my office's partnership with the City Redevelopment Agency, the Engineering and Capital Projects Department, the San Diego Police Department and Price Charities, I am pleased to report that 11 new streetlights have been added to City Heights in the following locations:

45th St. south of Polk Ave., east side Menlo Ave. south of Polk Ave., east side Menlo Ave. north of University Ave., west side Highland Ave. north of Dwight St., west side Highland Ave. north of Dwight St., east side 46th St. south of University Ave., west side Landis St. at 46th St. Landis St. east of Van Dyke Ave., south side Polk Ave. west of Marlborough Ave., south side Polk Ave. east of Van Dyke Ave., south side Highland Ave. near Landis St., east side

These lights promote safety and urban vitality in this critical neighborhood. Eleven more locations are being evaluated as part of an agreement to install a total of 22 lights within a 10 block radius of the Urban Village in City Heights.
