I am pleased to alert you to more upcoming events and provide you with an announcement of important measures passed today by the City Council to stimulate our local economy.

Creating and Sustaining Local Jobs

Today, the City Council approved two measures designed to preserve and create local building industry jobs at a time when many are struggling financially. These changes, which take effect this fall, extend the deadline on expiring building permits from one year to two, and give builders more time to pay fees. By extending the fee due dates to the end of construction, builders will be able to use precious cash on hand to hire workers and start projects. With San Diego County's unemployment rate being higher than 10%, these two measures will help create and retain jobs in some of the industries that have been hardest hit by the recession.
