Thank you to the transit riders and supporters who fought with me against the deep cuts to transit service over the past two months. While we were successful getting the Metropolitan Transit System (MTS) to continue some Sunday bus routes, our transit system has been severely reduced because of a lack of funding. Major service

I remain committed to strengthening public transportation in San Diego and am further motivated that several other regional leaders share my interest and passion for building a robust transit system.
