Community Gardens

Most of you share my enthusiasm for community gardens as places for environmental, social, nutritional and neighborhood enrichment. After two years of effort, I am pleased to report progress on facilitating the establishment of gardens.

For too long, the process for siting and creating gardens has been restrictive and onerous. At my request, City staff is developing a Community Garden Ordinance, aimed at streamlining the method for adding these amenities to our neighborhoods. The topic will be discussed at this Wednesday's Land Use and Housing Committee meeting, scheduled for 2:00 p.m. in the Council Committee Room in the City Administration Building, 202 C Street.

The Latest on the Greater Golden Hill Community Plan Update

The next meeting of the Greater Golden Hill Community Plan Update Advisory Committee (CPUAC) will be March 2 from 6:30 to 8:30 p.m. The meeting will likely be at the Golf Course Clubhouse.

The main topic will be continuing review of community input collected thus far, including input from the charettes, prior to drafting the update to the community plan. The City's goal is to capture, track, prioritize and categorize all of the individual comments received. The ongoing work of the CPUAC is to assist with prioritization of the comments, as there are a variety of ways that individual comments can be translated into community plan policies. Detailed comments on current City operations or maintenance of City infrastructure can also be forwarded to the responsible departments for review.
