North Park Clean and Safe District

North Park today is far different from the North Park I knew growing up. For anyone who has not been to the neighborhood in the last decade, it would likely be barely recognizable. From the Birch North Park Theatre to the varied restaurants to the unique coffeehouses to the diverse artists, the area has undergone a true renaissance.

The renaissance of North Park has certainly had impacts, and an effort is underway to directly address some of the challenging effects: a Clean and Safe district. Modeled after successful programs in Little Italy and parts of downtown, a Clean and Safe district would give the community the tools needed to enhance successes and to mitigate some of the impacts of the reinvigorated business area.

North Park neighbors will soon have the opportunity to weigh in on the proposed Clean and Safe district. I am eager for North Park to have a dialog on this proposal that could make a great difference in our prospering community.

The City Council will consider a resolution of intention to form the district at our May 24 meeting. Ballots would be sent out to the affected property owners within a day or two after that to ensure a minimum 45-day balloting period per state law. A public hearing including ballot tabulation is scheduled to be held as part of the City Council meeting on July 12.
