Road Repaving Ramps Up This Week; Additional Street Repairs Also Approved

I am pleased to announce that 13 streets in and around District Three will be repaved by next week, and the City Council approved street repairs and resurfacing for several additional locations throughout the City on July 18.

Making sure our roads are in good condition is a way the City can strengthen the quality of life in our neighborhoods.

Some of the street segments being worked on this week have been problematic for years. Boundary Street, in particular, has been the source of many complaints. Demonstrating my belief that there are few things sexier than freshly paved streets, I will be on site as the crews fill in surface cracks on Boundary Street tomorrow.

Contrary to how some may feel, infrastructure work like street repairs is exciting to me. It shows our commitment to core services and literally protects the foundation of our City. Since I took office in December 2008, 300 blocks of streets have been repaved in our district – the equivalent of more than 27 miles.

By Friday, July 29, milling and paving work will begin in the following District Three locations:

- Madison Avenue between Wilson Avenue and 36th Street and between 38th Street and 40th Street
- Collier Avenue between Hawley Boulevard and E. Mountain View
- Copley Avenue from Utah Street to the end
- 30th Street between Adams Avenue and Suncrest Drive
- Boundary Street from the cul-de-sac south of Madison to Suncrest Drive, from Landis Street to Redwood Street, and from Olive Street to Covington Road
- Kansas Street between Meade Avenue and El Cajon Boulevard
- 31st Street between Landis Street and North Park Way
- Upas Street between 32nd Street and 33rd Street
- Maple Street from Montclair Street to Haller Street
- 32nd Street from its origin to Kalmia Street
- Bancroft Street from Juniper Street to Ivy Street
- 6th Avenue near Arbor from end to end
- 35th from Monroe Avenue to Meade Avenue

District Three street segments that the City Council approved for repair in the coming months

- 1st Avenue between Pennsylvania Avenue and Robinson Avenue
- 28th Street between Wightman Street and Dwight Street
- 31st Street between Ivy Street and Juniper Street and between Dwight Street and Landis Street
- 36th Street between Monroe Avenue and Adams Avenue
- 39th Street between Quince Street and Redwood Street
- 46th Street between Landis Street and Wightman Street and between Thorn Street and Myrtle Avenue
- A Street between the 32nd Street Canyon to 34th Street
- Adams Avenue between 30th Street and Bonnie Court
- Boundary Street between North Park Way and Landis Street
- El Cajon Boulevard between 33rd Street and 36th Street
- Felton Street between El Cajon Boulevard and Meade Avenue
- Ivy Street between Bancroft Street and 33rd Street
- Madison Avenue between Texas Street and the 805 ramps
- McKinley Street between Redwood Street and Thorn Street
- Monroe Avenue between Mississippi Street and Texas Street
- Myrtle Avenue between Park Villa Drive and Ray Street

Plaza de Panama MOU: Environmental Review Does Not Guarantee Project Approval

Yesterday, the San Diego City Council agreed to move forward with a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with the Plaza de Panama Committee to complete environmental reports on potential projects to remove cars from the Plaza de Panama in Balboa Park.

Environmental review will be necessary in order to accomplish any of the visions for removing parking and traffic from the Plaza de Panama. Proceeding with the Environmental Impact Report is in the overall best interest of the Park, and will only be accomplished with the approval of the MOU.

While I have strong concerns about the potential impacts of the Plaza de Panama Committee's proposed project, I am interested in having the analysis of the project and alternatives so that when the time comes I can weigh all of the possibilities in the correct context. The MOU does not commit me or the City Council to supporting the project once the EIR is completed.
