City of San Diego Seeks Input on Ways to Shape and Improve Local Economy

FOUR WORKSHOPS WILL BE HELD TO GET RESIDENTS' THOUGHTS ON DEFINING GOALS FOR SAN DIEGO

SAN DIEGO – Do you have an idea that could help build a more prosperous and equitable economy for San Diego? The City of San Diego is inviting residents and business representatives to attend the upcoming <u>Community Engagement Days</u> on Dec. 12 and 13 to share their thoughts about the future of our local economy.

These workshops will provide attendees a chance to provide input and ask questions that will help further define the goals, objectives and tactics of the <u>Economic Development Department</u> as it prepares for fiscal year 2024 and beyond.

"It's our hope that people will join us to share their best and biggest ideas about how we can shape our economy for future generations as well as those who currently reside in our great city," said Christina Bibler, Director of the Economic Development Department.

Four workshops will be held over the course of two days. The first workshop will be Monday, Dec. 12, from 2 to 3:30 p.m., and the second workshop from 5:30 to 7 p.m. Both workshops on Dec. 12 will take place at the Valencia Park/Malcolm X Branch Library, 5148 Market St.

The first workshop on Tuesday, Dec. 13, will be from 10 to 11:30 a.m. and the second will be from 5:30 to 7 p.m. Both workshops will take place at UC San Diego Park & Market, 1100 Market St., on the third floor in rooms 318 and 319.
