

Errata to Addendum to Negative Declaration No. 225045/SCH No. 2013041059 Seasonal Closure of Point La Jolla and Boomer Beach

May 19, 2022

The City of San Diego has revised the Addendum to Negative Declaration No. 225045 (SCH No. 2013041059) in response to the input received from the California Coastal Commission Meeting held on April 8, 2022. These edits were made to correct factual inaccuracies or typographical errors, or to provide clarifying information in the Addendum, and are described in this errata, as indicated in ~~strikeout~~/underline format below. Specifically, the title of the Addendum has been changed to reflect the closure of Boomer Beach during the sea lion pupping season, the project site plan has been revised, and additional details have been included in the project description. These changes apply throughout this Addendum.

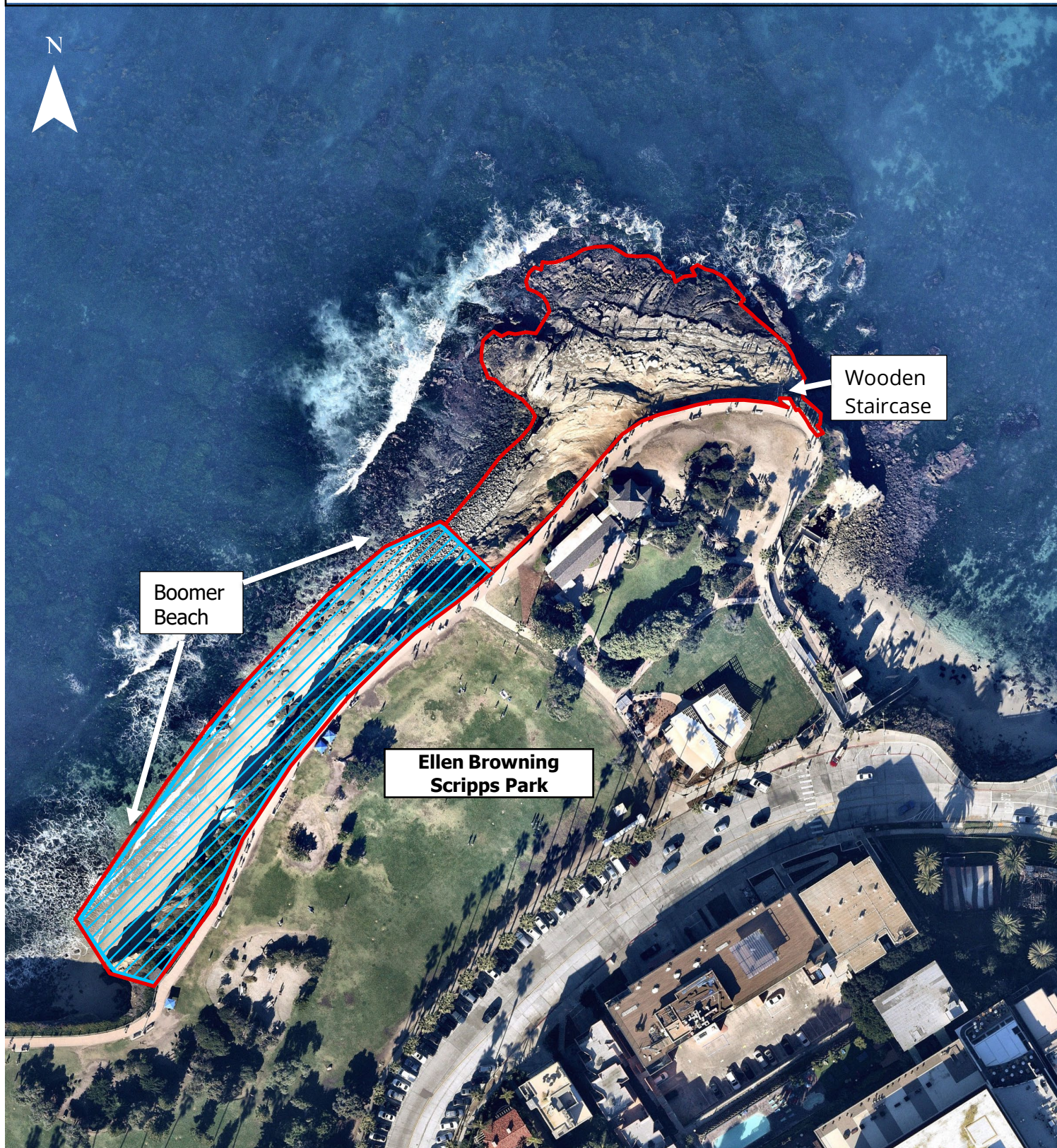
In accordance with the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Guidelines Section 15088.5, the addition of new information that clarifies, amplifies, or makes insignificant modifications does not require recirculation as there are no new impacts and no new mitigation identified. An environmental document need only be recirculated when there is identification of new significant environmental impacts or the addition of a new mitigation measure is required to avoid a significant environmental impact. These corrections do not result in any new physical effects and do not affect the conclusions of the environmental analysis contained within the Addendum.

Corrections:

1. On page 1 the Subject section, is revised as follows:

SUBJECT: Seasonal Closure of Point La Jolla and Boomer Beach: Seasonal closure of Point La Jolla and Boomer Beach, seven days a week, beginning ~~May 25~~May 1 and ending on ~~September 15~~October 31 during sea lion pupping season. The closure will include signs posted for the area closed, K-rail barrier(s), and a chain to cordon off the beach wooden access stairs at the border of Point La Jolla and La Jolla Cove. The public will be allowed to traverse Boomer Beach immediately adjacent to the closure area for purposes of an “access corridor” to engage in ocean swimming activities only (please refer to the revised Project Site Plan which also includes Boomer Beach). Leashed and unleashed dogs, *except for service dogs while in service*, will not be permitted on the beach and rocky area of Point La Jolla, Boomer Beach, and the immediate beach areas (defined as the rocky area between La Jolla Cove and Boomer Beach) year-round, within the closure area. The Project is located at 1160 Coast Blvd., La Jolla, CA 92037 in the La Jolla Community Planning area in Council District 1.
