Be Prepared- Create Defensible Space

San Diego has experienced record-breaking rainfall over the last year. Unfortunately, much of the grass that has sprout up from the rain has already dried out and poses a very large fire hazard. San Diego County, state and local fire officials are advising residents to obey the law and create 100 feet of defensible space for the safety of their homes and for firefighters.

Defensible space is 30 feet of lean, clean and green zone and 70 feet of reduced fuel zone.
