

FROM BLIGHT TO BEAUTIFUL, GRAFFITI-PRONE WALLS BECOME COMMUNITY MURALS
Clairemont Residents Invited to Provide Final Brush Strokes on Large-Scale Art, Commissioned by SDG&E

San Diego, CA: Graffiti is one of the most visible of all crimes committed. It generates community concern and invites criminals to our neighborhoods. San Diego Gas & Electric (SDG&E) takes pride in their properties and the communities that they serve. To eradicate the graffiti on two sound walls in Clairemont, SDG&E worked in partnership with Councilmember Cate's office and the Clairemont Town Council to commission local artists, Jason and Frieda Gould, for a two-mural project. Once completed, the murals will span 340 linear feet, which is longer than a football field. 2,100 square feet of art will transform graffiti-prone walls to visual masterpieces.
