## Help to Others San Diego (H2O SD) Program Qualifications

Funded through charitable donations, the H2O SD Program helps qualified low-income customers with their water and wastewater utility bill. Qualifying residential customers may receive a credit up to \$100 on their utility bill once in a 12-month period. Customers must reapply for subsequent years and meet all of the following criteria to receive assistance:

- **1.** Limited to Public Utilities residential customers and the bill must be in the name of the residential customer seeking assistance.
- **2.** The address of the Public Utilities bill must be the customer's primary residence.
- **3.** Potential applicants must live in the City of San Diego in a single-family residence.
- 4. Be an account holder and responsible for paying the water utility bill.
- All household members' income must be combined for a gross annual household income within the SDG&E CARE Program income requirements, effective from June 1, 2019 through May 31, 2020, listed below:

- **6.** Receive public assistance from at least one of the following public assistance programs:
  - Medicaid/Medi-Cal for Families A & B
  - CalFresh (Food Stamps) SNAP
  - Head Start Income Eligible (Tribal Only)
  - Bureau of Indian Affairs General Assistance
  - Women, Infants and Children (WIC)
  - Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP)
  - Supplemental Security Income (SSI)
  - CalWORKs (TANF) or Tribal TANF
