Gentlemen,

You recently passed an ordinance forbidding swimming in the San Diego River.

If the thousands of Children of East San Diego were provided with a swimming pool few of them would walk miles to the River pools.

In 1937 as a member of the City Council I was able to get the Board of Education to deed two lots on Highland Ave, (Noover School) to the city for swimming pool purposes. The Council at that time placed in the budget money to cover the city's share of this recreational project. I left the Council in 1937, and the Council that followed let it die, and the lots were returned to the Board of Education. But I believe they are willing to provide ground on the Chaumonne ave side of Noover School.

Balboa Park is too far away from E. S. D. also when are you going to improve the Park at 54th and University, also Playground adjoining Jackson School? Recreation for E. S. D. has been too long neglected. The all you residents who pay the taxes need these facilities as well as the transients who go to the beaches.
