Introductions

Review of Working Group No. 3 Summary

Focus was on identifying whether the indicators do a good job of appropriately determining whether the goals are being met as well as asking the question: "Is this a realistic approach?" The group made it clear to move forward by developing a full awareness of the information that is attainable to use now.

Community Voice and Input/Indicator modification:

6a: Modified Retail Food Environment index (Number of healthy food outlets within a specified radius by population; national index for comparison, use SIC permitting process) (**GREEN**)

- Data Source:
 - HHSA-labor intensive
 - o 2009 baseline
 - Fall/Oct/Nov as potential baseline- City and County will develop data source and methodology.
- Need/other considerations:
 - Potential number of contracts for AB551- City to manage contracts
 - o North American Industry Classification (similar to MRFEI)
 - Consideration level of data HHSA will share (e.g., aggregate)

6a: Rates of Chronic Disease (YELLOW)

- Data Source:
 - o Behavioral risk factor survey
 - HHSA available at zip code and county working on developing census track
 - o Community health center Universal Data System data (by clinic)
 - OSHPD data (aggregated by HHSA)

- Need/other considerations:
 - Be There San Diego
 - o 3-4-50 Data

(6a): Rates of Chronic Disease (YELLOW)

- Data Source:
 - To be determined: WIC data?
 - Healthcare providers based on health records
 - School and healthcare data

6b: Improved infrastructure (from Safety); SIP; walkability score (realtor); land use and urban agriculture. (PINK)

- Data Source:
 - o BID
 - o CIP (3b, 2b,)
- Need/other considerations:
 - Walkability score coming to be available at the parcel level
 - If determine to track Policy impact- what are the cross cutting policies (counts of policies vs. impact and enforcement)

6c: Number of people in Promise Zone with Insurance: (GREEN)

- Data Source:
 - Behavior Risk Factor Survey (BRFS)
 - Consumer Spending
 - Proxy ACA enrollment and re-enrollment
 - License providers in MHS
 - ID specific providers in PZ to track over time
- Need/ other considerations
 - Does San Diego Promise Zone want behavioral health- medically underserved by behavioral health, active living, dental, and primary

Green - what we think we can do now

- Yellow we think we know where its coming from, we just have to dig a little deeper to get it
- Pink cross-team communication across work groups. We know we need to track these, but don't quite know how yet
- White: bike rack; consider tracking in future
