# City of San Diego Weekly Immigrant Affairs Update

In response to the ruling by a U.S. district court in Texas that the <u>DACA</u> program is unlawful, <u>Cities for Action</u> (C4A) <u>issued a statement</u> standing with Dreamers and advocating for a pathway to citizenship. Mayor Gloria is one of three C4A cochairs alongside Mayor Lightfoot of Chicago and Mayor de Blasio of New York.

## **CITY PROGRAMS & SERVICES**

- The <u>City of San Diego</u> and <u>County</u> COVID-19 emergency housing assistance programs can now pay **100% of unpaid and future rent** to landlords and tenants for eligible households, <u>regardless of immigration status</u>. ## NEW DATA, REPORTS, & PODCASTS

- The <u>Emerson Collective</u> compiled a <u>list of resources for DACA recipients and</u> <u>allies</u> as a result of the recent ruling.
- According to <u>data from New American Economy</u>, nearly half (48.9%) of all agricultural workers are foreign-born, and more than a quarter (27.3%) are undocumented. In California, immigrants make up 80% of the farm workforce. Fewer young immigrant workers are entering the agricultural labor force to replace aging workers, and the H-2A visa is insufficient to meet demand.
