City of San Diego Weekly Immigrant Affairs Update

<u>Federal Updates</u>: (1) DHS will publish the <u>Federal Register Notice</u> on August 3rd newly designating Haiti for TPS for 18 months. (2) The <u>State Dept. announced</u> <u>Priority 2 (P-2) refugee status</u> for certain Afghans and eligible family members.

<u>State Update</u>: <u>Medi-Cal</u> will expand <u>coverage</u> to all low-income Californians 50 years of age and older, regardless of immigration status.

CITY PROGRAMS & SERVICES

- The City of San Diego is bringing back the **Youth Commission** to help amplify the voices of young people at City Hall. If you know interested candidates who are ages 14-22, please share <u>this application link</u>.
- If your organization has questions, concerns, or needs to relay to the San Diego USCIS field office, please reach out to Immigrant Affairs Manager, Farhat Popal. The City is dedicated to advocating for our immigrant community and immigrant-serving organizations, and helping relay and resolve issues.
- While the <u>federal eviction moratorium ended</u> on July 31, the <u>California</u> <u>eviction moratorium</u> is in place through September 30. The <u>City of San Diego</u> and <u>County</u> COVID-19 emergency housing assistance programs can pay **100%** of unpaid and future rent to landlords and tenants for eligible households, <u>regardless of immigration status</u>.

NEW DATA, REPORTS, & PODCASTS

- DHS has updated their DACA Frequently Asked Questions site—see here. See also <u>Steps to Take if Your DACA Renewal Is Delayed</u> from the National Immigration Law Center.
- A new <u>Urban Institute report</u> found that **3 in 10 adults** in California immigrant families with low incomes surveyed avoided public benefit programs or other assistance in 2020 because of green card or other immigration concerns. The report includes a section on opportunities for outreach and trust-building.
- The County of San Diego launched <u>Vaccines for all Ages and Stages of Life</u>, a website that includes information and resources about **immunizations recommended** throughout different stages of life.

FUNDING OPPORTUNITIES

 The <u>San Diego County District Attorney's Community Grant Program (CGP)</u> seeks to engage San Diego County community-based organizations to identify and implement **new and innovative methods to address community safety** and expand community assets. Grant funding up to \$50,000 will be provided to participating organizations for a maximum of one year to grow promising community-based solutions that produce positive results in the following focus areas: youth and family support, environmental justice, protecting vulnerable youth, and victim support.
