

City of San Diego Weekly Immigrant Affairs Update

Last week, the U.S. Conference of Mayors (USCM) Executive Committee approved <u>five resolutions led by Mayor Todd Gloria</u>. The resolutions prioritized homelessness, infrastructure, ending travel restrictions, and support for Afghan refugees.

The White House announced <u>Operation Allies Welcome</u>, and directed the Department of Homeland Security to serve as the lead agency coordinating ongoing efforts across the federal government to resettle Afghans. The Interagency Unified Coordination Group will report directly to Secretary Mayorkas. Initiatives will include initial immigration processing, COVID-19 testing, isolation of COVID-positive individuals for anticipated quarantine, and processing at predesignated U.S. military bases prior to being resettled into communities.
