City of San Diego Weekly Immigrant Affairs Update

The White House released the first-ever <u>National Strategy On Gender Equity and</u> <u>Equality</u>, developed by the White House Gender Policy Council (GPC). "Promote Gender Equity and Fairness in Justice and Immigration Systems" is on pgs. 24-26.

Beginning Oct.1, 1) <u>all applicants for adjustment of status</u>, 2) <u>all immigrant visa</u> <u>applicants</u>, 3) <u>all fiancé(e) visa applicants</u>, and 4) <u>nonimmigrant visa applicants</u> <u>who are referred to panel physicians</u> will be required to receive a full COVID-19 vaccine series as part of their medical exam prior to being issued a visa or granted a green card.

On Oct. 20, USCIS announced the issuance of updated and comprehensive <u>policy</u> <u>guidance regarding applications for T nonimmigrant status, or T visas</u>, for victims of severe forms of trafficking in persons.

On Oct. 21, USCIS published information about how to apply for <u>work</u> <u>authorization</u> under the designation of Deferred Enforced Departure (DED) for Hong Kong, first announced on Aug. 5.

CITY PROGRAMS, SERVICES, & UPDATES

- Mayor Gloria joined 44 mayors from across the country to <u>advocate for key</u> <u>housing investments</u> in the Build Back Better Act.
- The <u>Social Equity Early Action Transit Pilot</u>, which would provide free transit for one year for youth 18 and under, was <u>approved</u> at the Oct. 22 SANDAG Board of Directors meeting.

NEW DATA, REPORTS, & PODCASTS

- <u>Kaiser Family Foundation (KFF) found</u> a substantial disparity in COVID-19 vaccination rates between undocumented immigrants, and U.S. citizens and lawful residents. The latest survey found that about 25% of "potentially undocumented" immigrants in the U.S. received their vaccine — half the average rate of U.S. adults. The study found that the discrepancy is primarily due to fear of deportation and lack of access to government programs.
- The Migration Policy Institute recently started a 20th anniversary podcast series, World of Migration. The podcast is available on <u>MPI's website</u>, Podbean, or wherever you get your audio content.
- A new season of the KPBS podcast, <u>Port of Entry</u>, is out!

- The City of San Diego has released guidelines for two funding opportunities to support arts and culture activities, between July 1, 2022 and June 30, 2023. Guidelines can be found <u>here</u>. Deadline to apply is Oct. 31, 2021.
- The San Diego Workforce Partnership has announced two <u>RFPs to provide</u> <u>employment services in San Diego County</u> through their career centers. Proposals are due December 10.
