# City of San Diego Weekly Immigrant Affairs Update

The Department of Homeland Security (DHS) will issue a Notice of Proposed Rulemaking that would regulate how DHS applies the public charge ground of inadmissibility. Advance copy is <u>here</u>, and public comments can be provided <u>here</u>.

As part of the reopening and expansion of the <u>Central American Minors program</u>, U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services and the Department of State will provide updates at a <u>stakeholder engagement meeting</u> on March 9 at 11 am PT.

Governor Newsom unveiled the <u>SMARTER Plan</u> charting California's path forward on the pandemic response.

## **CITY PROGRAMS, SERVICES, & UPDATES**

- Mayor Gloria lit up Balboa Park in blue and yellow, the colors of the Ukrainian flag, in solidarity with the people of Ukraine.
- <u>Build Better SD</u> is a citywide initiative that supports the City of San Diego's equity, access, conservation and sustainability goals. <u>This initiative</u> seeks to create more opportunities for innovative, culturally relevant and interactive public spaces by prioritizing investments in areas where needs are greatest.
- A <u>new exhibition</u> at the City of San Diego's Central Library art gallery breaks barriers with cross-border artists. Open through May 2, 2022.

## NEW DATA, REPORTS, & PODCASTS

• In <u>Advancing Digital Equity among Immigrant-Origin Youth</u>, the Migration Policy Institute traces the negative impacts of the digital divide and other barriers to learning for immigrant-origin students from low-income households, including higher rates of absenteeism and disenrollment. Lack of access to reliable internet was the biggest reported challenge in the shift to remote learning, as well as problematic learning management systems, slow internet speeds, data caps and connectivity dead zones. Schools that fared better in the transition to remote learning had laptop programs for students in place before the pandemic, and offered material and social supports.

- The <u>Cultural Pathways program</u> strengthens the capacity of small, new, and emerging arts organizations rooted in communities of color, recent immigrant & refugee communities, and tribal/indigenous groups, and will anchor their cultural/creative work into the cultural landscape of CA. Deadline is March 9.
- The Center for Inclusion and Belonging at the American Immigration Council is issuing a <u>Call for Bridging Communities Projects</u> to crowdsource the best ideas & activities that bring people together to work toward the common good while building relationships that help bridge group differences. Deadline is March 15.
