The CDC terminated Title 42 for unaccompanied migrant children only.

<u>March 15 was Equal Pay Day</u>—women in the U.S. must work until this day in order to be paid the same amount men were paid in the prior year.

The reauthorization of the <u>Violence Against Women Act</u> was signed into law.
