## **CITY PROGRAMS & SERVICES**

- <u>In-person services are now available at 26 San Diego Public Library locations</u>. Patrons can browse, use computer and printing services, pick up holds and renew their library cards. Select library locations also offer free Wi-Fi, internet access and laptop use through <u>SD Access 4 All</u>. In addition to the sites offering in-person services, four additional <u>locations</u> will be open for contactless pickup service. <u>Book drops</u> are open 24 hours a day, 7 days a week at all locations.
