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Organization of the New Board of Trustees
5th. Class Charter

Office of the Board of Trustees of
the City of San Diego, Cal. April 18th, 1887.

The Members of the Board of Trustees of the City of San Diego, State of California, elected April 11th, 1887. met this day at 2 o'clock P. M. for the purpose of organizing the Board, and for the transaction of business. Present Trustees elect, A. H. Julian, M. D. Hamilton, J. A. McRae, J. H. Woolman and C. C. Valle and Deputy City Clerk J. A. Thomas, each of which Trustees elect now present and file with the ^{Deputy} Clerk their respective Constitutional Oaths of office, duly subscribed and sworn to by each, before a proper officer authorized to administer such oaths. Deputy Clerk Thomas now calls the Board to order, and calls the roll of Trustees elect, the full Board being present.

On motion of Trustee Julian, duly seconded, Trustee M. D. Hamilton is unanimously elected President of the Board pro tempore. The President pro tem, stated the first business in order to be the election of a Permanent President of the Board. — On motion it is ordered that the Board now proceed to the nomination and election of its permanent President. The President pro tem now declares nominations for Permanent President in order.

Trustee Julian places Trustee M. D. Hamilton in nomination for Permanent President. There being no other nominations made, Trustee M. D. Hamilton is on motion duly seconded, and by the unanimous vote of the Board, elected Permanent President of the Board.

On motion of Trustee McRae duly seconded it is ordered that an informal ballot be taken to elect a City Clerk and Clerk of the Board. — The President now declares nominations for Clerk in order, and appoints Trustee McRae as Teller. Trustee Woolman places J. H. Talbott in nomination, Trustee Julian places J. A. Thomas in nomination and Trustee Valle places Frank Mandeville in nomination for the office of City Clerk and Clerk of the Board of Trustees. The nominations being closed the Board proceeded to ballot; and the ballot being cast the Teller announces five votes cast, and on counting the same J. H. Talbott had one vote, and J. A. Thomas had three votes and Frank Mandeville had one

vote. On motion of Trustee McRae, duly seconded, the election for clerk was made formal. The President thereupon declared J. A. Thomas duly elected and appointed to the office of City Clerk and Clerk of the Board of Trustees in and for the City of San Diego.

On motion of Trustee Julian the appointment of the other City officers is postponed until the next meeting of the Board.

A communication from Walter Ferral withdrawing from the contest for the position of City Attorney is read and ordered filed.

A communication in the form of a petition from the President, Secretary and other members of San Diego Engine Co. No 1, recommending the re-appointment of Mr Sam McDowell to the position of Chief Engineer of the Fire Department, is read and ordered filed.

On motion the Official Bond of the City Treasurer is fixed in the penal sum of \$40,000.⁰⁰

On motion the Official Bond of the City Marshall and ex-officio Tax Collector is fixed in the penal sum of \$30,000.⁰⁰

On motion the Official Bond of the City Recorder is fixed in the penal sum of \$4,000.⁰⁰

On motion the Official Bond of the City Attorney is fixed in the penal sum of \$3,000.⁰⁰

On motion the Official Bond of the City Health Officer is fixed in the penal sum of \$5,000.⁰⁰

QUALITY.

All pipe to be thoroughly vitrified, either slip glazed or salt glazed, and must be sound, with a clear ring when struck. Defects of glazing on the outside need not reject, but inside glazing must be perfect.

Lumps, bubbles, etc., on the inside, such as

would catch fibrous matters, must cause rejection. All sockets must be large enough to take all spigots, and leave sufficient room for a gasket $\frac{1}{4}$ inch thick to be pressed in all around and fully to the bottom when the pipes are held concentric.

Variation from the true circle exceeding three (3) per cent. of the interior diameter must cause rejection. Imperfections of socket or spigot, unless slight and at points that may be laid within the top third of the circumference of the sewers, must cause rejection.

Pipes having a slight curve may be accepted to the extent to which they may be used in passing curves; and such pipes must have no defect in body, spigot or socket, that would not come within the top third of the circumference of the sewer as laid in the trench.

All pipes may, at the option of the Resident Engineer, have a preliminary inspection before delivery at the bank of the trench. All will be thoroughly inspected on the ground, before being lowered into the trench. All pipe rejected at this final inspection will be indelibly marked as condemned, and all such must, at the cost of the contractor, be removed from the work, and stored at such place and during such time as may be designated by the Resident Engineer.

Pipe delivered in the city of San Diego, and provisionally accepted by the Resident Engineer, will be paid for at the rate of 75 per cent. of the contract price.

Final payment of 25 per cent. will be made monthly on the Engineer's estimate of the length of pipe actually laid in completed sewers. At such payment, proper deduction will be made for rejected pipe on which the preliminary 75 per cent. shall have been paid.

It will be made a condition of the contract that the contractor undertaking to furnish pipe under these specifications shall bear all costs of transportation, storage, handling, handling for inspection, rejection and breakage, the price bid being the price to be received by such contractor (or such pipe only as shall have been finally laid in the works), the same being in full of all demands of such contractor against the city of San Diego, or its agents or representatives.

Any addition to the above quantities required to complete the work, according to the plan of sewerage adopted, to be delivered and paid for at the foregoing prices and under the foregoing conditions.

Specifications for digging and back filling sewer trenches in the following streets of the city of San Diego, namely: 1st, 2d, 3d, 7th, 8th and 9th streets, for an aggregate length of twenty thousand (20,000) feet.

Depths of cutting as shown by profiles to be seen at the office of the Resident Engineer of the Sewerage of San Diego.

The trenches to be excavated to, and not below, a depth two inches above the grade shown by the profile—to be indicated by the Engineer as the work progresses. Work shall be begun and carried on at such points and in such manner as the Engineer may indicate.

The pipe-laying gangs will fill the trenches to a depth of one foot over the top of the pipes. The contractor is to complete the filling.

All work to be done in accordance with these specifications, to-wit: The width of the trench at the bottom to be at least 24 inches, and at the top at least 36 inches, with a uniform batter at the sides.

Wherever the ground is disposed to cave or slide, it must be supported by proper bracing or sheet piling, as the Engineer may direct. When sheet piling is ordered by the Engineer to be left in place, it will be paid for at its proper actual cost as an extra. No other lumber will be allowed for in the estimates.

Such portions of the excavated earth as the Engineer may indicate, in quality and quantity, shall be thrown to one side of the trench, to be used for covering the pipe. The remainder of the excava-

tion will be thrown to the other side of the trench. Under no circumstances are stubs or grade pegs to be distributed or covered.

The trench must not be opened for more than 300 feet in advance of the pipe-laying, nor left unfilled more than 100 feet in the rear of the pipe-laying.

The work must be carried on at such rate of speed as to allow the pipe-laying gangs to be uninterrupted in their work. Any delay or overcrowding of these gangs is so be compensated for by such damages, to be paid by the contractor to the city, as the Resident Engineer may determine to be just.

The contractor must maintain barricades and lights to prevent accidents to passengers in the streets, and must take special precautions to ensure the safety of buildings and property near the excavation.

All ordinances relating to such precautions and safeguards must be fully and faithfully observed by the contractor, he holding himself personally amenable for any violation of them by his employees or agents.

In ditching about water and gas pipes, special care must be exercised, and if any injury is caused by the carelessness or neglect of any workman, the cost of repair is to be deducted by the city from the compensation of the contractor, and should be by him deducted from the wages of such workman.

Back filling to a depth of one foot over the top of the pipe will be done by pipe-laying gangs.

The filling above this depth will be done by the contractor. The earth will be thoroughly rammed in layers—one man ramming for each man filling; or the filling shall be puddled in with water, or both, as the Engineer shall direct.

In crossing streets, gutters, crosswalks and other places over which there is a great amount of travel, special attention will be given to making the filling compact; and when the Engineer requires it, a portion of the street will be planked.

As the work progresses, and at least as fast as the Engineer shall direct, all surplus earth, material and rubbish shall be removed from the street by the contractor, at his own expense.

All portions of the work shall be at all times subject to the control of the Engineer and his representatives, and all their orders shall be promptly and completely executed.

Ten per cent. of the compensation to be paid to the contractor under this agreement shall be retained for such time as the Resident Engineer shall determine, not exceeding three months from the completion of the work. If during this full period the contractor shall maintain the street in good condition over the filling, this retained money shall be paid to him on the certificate of the Resident Engineer.

Should the contractor, at any time, neglect, for more than twenty-four hours, to make good any defect in the filling, the Resident Engineer shall have authority to make the same good and to deduct the cost of so doing from the ten per cent herein provided to be retained from the amount due the contractor.

The Resident Engineer shall make a certified estimate at the end of each month of the length of trench excavated and completely refilled in exact compliance with these specifications, during such month, and the contractor shall be paid the full compensation due—therefore under this agreement less the ten per cent above provided to be retained.

Bidders will state, in figures and in writing, the number of cents per linear foot for which they will completely perform the work provided for in this agreement.

All proposals offered shall be accompanied by a check, payable to the order of the President of the Board of Trustees of said city, certified by a responsible bank, for an amount which shall not be less than five per cent. of the aggregate of the proposal, or by a bond for the said amount, with condition that bidder will carry out the terms of his bid, signed by the bidder, and by two good sureties, who shall justify before an officer competent to administer oaths, in double said amount, over and above all statutory exemptions.

NOTICE is hereby given that sealed proposals will be received by the City of San Diego, California, up to the hour of 7 o'clock, p. m., on the 3rd day of June, 1887, at the room of Board of Trustees of said City, for Sewer Flushtanks, as described in the following specifications, to-wit:

116 flushtanks, with siphons, water connection pipes, iron rings, and covers complete, as per drawing at the office of Resident Engineer Sewerage of San Diego.

Each flushtank is to be a round cistern, built with four-inch walls laid in cement mortar, to be made of one part of Portland cement and two parts of clean sharp sand. All cement used will be furnished by the City at its yard, and the contractor will be charged for it at the rate paid by the City. Such charge to be a payment to the contractor as a partial payment under the contract. Mortar will be mixed dry and wetted only as used.

When the flushtank is finished the inside of the brick work will be rendered with a smooth coating of neat Portland cement, at least 1/8 inch thick. All brick used must be sound, true and hard burned.

The flushtank will be covered with a four-inch dome brought into a neck to receive the cast iron

ring and cover, weighing not less than 300 pounds.

The walls being built to the spring of the dome, the bottom of the tank should be properly excavated so as to allow at least two inches below the bottom of the outlet chamber of the siphon. This excavation should then be filled to a depth of not more than two inches with cement mortar. The siphon and its outlet chamber should then be set so that the surface of the cover will be one inch higher than the bottom of the tank when finished. Then the whole of the excavation, quite to the outer end of the outlet chamber should be filled with cement mortar, the iron cover of the outlet chamber being made exactly level in both directions. When the mortar is firmly set so that the siphon will be readily held in its proper position, the whole bottom of the tank should be covered with cemented mortar to its finished level. The vitrified pipe connecting the outlet chamber with the sewer should then be laid and the opening in the brick wall through which it passes should then be filled up and made perfectly water tight. The pipe for connection with the sewer will be furnished by the city.

A 1/2 inch pipe for connecting the watersupply is to terminate inside of the tank in a 1/2 inch stop cock, by which the water pipe may be flushed or the tank rapidly filled. Behind the stop cock there is to be placed a "pet cock" or small faucet for the regular feeding of the tank. This faucet should stand a little above the highest water level. The 1/2 inch water pipe will extend one foot beyond the outside of the wall of the tank.

All work to be done according to the plans and to these specifications, under the direction of the Resident Engineer Sewerage of San Diego, and to

his satisfaction, and so certified by him.

Twenty-seven Sewer Manholes not to exceed the following depths, measuring from the grade of the street, to the invert of the sewer, to-wit:

Greatest depth, 15 feet; least depth, 3 1/2 feet; average depth, 7 1/2 feet.

All manholes are to be built of the best quality of hard burned brick, with eight inch walls, and laid in full beds and ends of mortar to be made of one part of Portland cement, and two parts of clean sharp sand.

Your Committee to whom was referred the application of the M.E. Church Society to place pillars or columns on the sidewalk, to support tower and baywindow on their building which they contemplate building on the corner of 4th and D. Streets,

They ask to be allowed to place two columns in front of main entrance, not to project more than 30 inches from the line of their lots, and two columns supporting bay-window not to project more than 18 inches from the line of their lots. It seems to your Committee that it has been customary to allow Citizens many such privileges, such as news stands, Lemonade stands, Boot Black stands etc, also stairways to basements occupy several feet of the sidewalk. Merchants occupy a portion of the sidewalk opposite their place of business (and sometimes monopolize it all). We are of the opinion that ornamental columns, such as are proposed in this case, will not be objectionable, and respectfully recommend the granting of the petition, provided it does not conflict with any Ordinance now in force.

The undersigned Committee on Wharfs & Harbors, beg leave to report, that we have visited the Babcock and Story wharf, and found that work was suspended, in accordance with the notice which had been given served on Babcock and Story sometime ago, to discontinue work, and remove that portion of the wharf outside of that which is covered by franchise, In conference with Mr Babcock, he stated to the committee that they had not sufficient room or wharf facilities for even the present demands, that they intended to apply to the City Council for an extension of their franchise, but as it took so much time to go through all the necessary proceedings to procure a franchise, that they did not think that there would be any objections to it, they proceeded with the work, which he claims is necessary to accommodate large ships to unload

at the wharf, as the wharf covered by franchise did not extend into deep water far enough. That the extension certainly was no obstruction to the channel, and that they would like to complete so far as they have the piles driven. That if it can be shown that this addition to their wharf is an obstruction, they will take it out. Now inasmuch as the attention of the superintendent of the Coast Survey has been called to the matter and that he has directed his assistant Mr Rogers to investigate the situation, your Committee recommend that action on the part of this Board be deferred for the present,

Hitchcock, member of the School Board, states that owing to the crowded condition of the schools there are a great many children that can not be admitted and a school in Middletown is very much needed, but there being no funds in the Treasury they desired the help of the Board of Trustees.

On motion Trustee McRae is appointed to act with the School Board in regard to procuring a site for a school house.

Mr C. A. Wetmore appears before the Board in the matter of the Boulevard, and asks that the City Engineer be instructed to establish the route and grade on Atlantic Street for a Boulevard. The President states that the contract with Mr Sheldon to construct the Boulevard still stands, and that he would recommend that nothing be done in the matter. All the members of the Board expressing the same opinion the matter is dropped.

The following communication from Mr H. Drury is read, to wit:

San Diego May 23rd 1887

To the Honorable Board City Trustees
Gentlemen.

In reply to your request that Mr Wilbur be allowed to use Oregon Pine in place of what is called for in the contract, knowing the difference in the two woods, and the detriment it will be to the building if I allow Oregon Pine to be used, and I also know

that Spruce could have been had long since had Mr Wilbur used proper diligence. I therefore respectfully decline to accede to your request.

 The center of said street shall be eighteen inches higher than the average of the gutter grades.  
 SEC. 2. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.  
 SEC. 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication as required by law.

The Superintendent of Streets appears before the Board and asks that Ordinance No 19. be amended so as to prohibit the burn-  
of paper and other rubbish on the streets, no action is taken in  
the matter.

#### ORDINANCE NO. 32.

An Ordinance establishing the grade of Sixteenth street, from 150 feet south of the south side of N street to the south line of the City Park, in the City of San Diego, State of California.

THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE CITY of San Diego do ordain as follows:

SECTION 1. The grade of Sixteenth street, from 150 feet south of the south side of N street to the south line of the City Park, is hereby established as follows:

The elevation of the points herein named above and below the datum line of levels fixed by Ordinance No. 3 shall be fixed as follows:

At a point 150 feet south of the southwest corner of Sixteenth and N streets, 8.0 feet; and at a point 80 feet due east of the last named point, 9.0 feet.

At the southwest corner of Sixteenth and N streets, 9.0 feet; at the northwest corner thereof, 10.5 feet; at the southeast corner thereof, 11.0 feet; and at the northeast corner thereof, 12.5 feet.

At the southwest corner of Sixteenth and M streets, 14.0 feet; at the northwest corner thereof, 14.5 feet; at the southeast corner thereof, 16.0 feet, and at the northeast corner thereof,

16.5 feet.

At the southwest corner of Sixteenth and L streets, 20.0 feet; at the northwest corner thereof, 22.0 feet; at the southeast corner thereof, 23.0 feet, and at the northeast corner thereof, 24.0 feet.

At the southwest corner of Sixteenth and K streets, 26.0 feet; at the northwest corner thereof, 26.5 feet; at the southeast corner thereof, 28.0 feet, and at the northeast corner thereof, 28.0 feet.

At the southwest corner of Sixteenth and H streets, 34.0 feet; at the northwest corner thereof, 34.0 feet; at the southeast corner thereof, 35.5 feet, and at the northeast corner thereof, 35.5 feet.

At the southwest corner of Sixteenth and G streets, 38.5 feet; at the northwest corner thereof, 39.0 feet; at the southeast corner thereof, 40.0 feet, and at the northeast corner thereof, 41.0 feet.

At the southwest corner of Sixteenth and F streets, 50.0 feet; at the northwest corner thereof, 53.0 feet; at the southeast corner thereof, 53.0 feet, and at the northeast corner thereof, 56.0 feet.

At the southwest corner of Sixteenth and E streets, 48.0 feet; at the northwest corner thereof, 45.0 feet; at the southeast corner thereof,

51.0 feet; and at the northeast corner thereof, 48.0 feet.

At the southwest corner of Sixteenth and D streets, 47.0 feet; at the northwest corner thereof, 47.5 feet; at the southeast corner thereof, 48.5 feet, and at the northeast corner thereof, 49.0 feet.

SEC. 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication as required by law.

Trustee Julian came in during the reading of the minutes and took his seat as member of the Board.

The following Ordinance is read and on motion of Trustee

M'Rae, seconded by Trustee Valle is passed, approved, adopted and ordered published by the following vote; Trustee Julian yea; Trustee Woolman yea; Trustee M'Rae yea; Trustee Hamilton yea; Trustee Valle yea. Said Ordinance being in words and and figures as follows, to wit;

### ORDINANCE NO. 83.

An Ordinance granting to W. J. Keller and C. E. Keller a franchise for the construction and operation of a street railroad in the city of San Diego.

THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE CITY of San Diego do ordain as follows:

Section 1. That the right of way be and the same is hereby granted to W. J. Keller and C. E. Keller for the purpose of constructing, laying down and operating a street railroad for the period of twenty (20) years along the public streets of the city of San Diego, with track of iron or steel rails, with the necessary switches and turnouts and the running of cars thereon, to be propelled by electricity, cable or horse-power.

Sec. 2. The line of said railroad shall be as follows: Commencing at Ivy street on Third street; thence south on Third street to Ash street; thence west on Ash street to Second street; thence south on Second street to I street; thence east on I street to Eighth street; thence south on Eighth street to K street; also on Ninth street from D street to N street; also on N street from Ninth street to Thirty-second street, to be propelled by electricity, cable, horse-power or steam as the Board of Trustees shall at any time direct.

Sec. 3. The above franchise and privileges are granted on the following conditions:

First. Said road shall be constructed throughout its entire length in the center of the streets along or over which it passes, or as near thereto as practicable, provided, that the Board of Trustees may at any time order and require any changes to be made in the line of said road where switches and turnouts are located.

Second. Said road shall be constructed with such rail as shall be previously approved by the Board of Trustees, and in such manner as to cause the least possible obstruction to the use of said streets.

Third. Said grantees, or their assigns, shall plank, pave or macadamize the entire length of said route between the rails, and for two feet on each side thereof, to correspond with said streets when the same shall be paved or macadamized, and shall keep the same constantly in good repair, flush with the grade of the streets, or the natural surface of the streets between the rails, and for four feet on each side thereof, whether said streets be paved or macadamized or not, and provided with good crossings for all kinds of vehicles, and with all necessary and proper flumes and culverts for the free and uninterrupted passage of water under said track. The track shall be four feet eight and one-half inches between the rails, and there shall be a space between the main tracks and side tracks, turnouts and switches sufficient to allow cars to pass each other freely and without danger. And where said streets are not paved or macadamized said track shall be girded by a plank on each side of the rails, not less than eight inches wide, and which shall be grooved and fitted closely to the rail, and must not be more than three-fourths of an inch below the top of the rail.

Fourth. The laying of said track and all side tracks, switches or turnouts shall conform in all cases where the grade of any of said streets has been established and such streets graded to such grade, and in all other cases as near to the natural grade of said streets as practicable, and when at any time any part of the route shall be graded, or the grade thereof changed or altered by the Board of Trustees, the bed of the road and tracks thereof shall be made to conform therewith. Provided, That no switch shall be constructed or maintained within fifty feet of any cross street, and the location of such switches or turnouts shall be changed at the cost of the holder of this franchise whenever so ordered by the Board of Trustees.

Fifth. Said road shall be constructed under the direction and supervision of the City Engineer, who shall, under the direction of the Board of Trustees, designate the rate of curves to be used in surveying the lines of the road from one street to another, where it is necessary to change the direction of sidings or switches, and shall give the

established grade of the streets along the line, and on the construction of said road shall set grade stakes along the line indicating the grade of said streets, and shall have general supervision of the construction and future maintenance of the road, and to see that the same is constructed and maintained in conformity to the terms and requirements of this ordinance. And for the services rendered by the City Engineer, as herein required, he shall receive such fees as are customary for such services, and the same shall be paid by the holder of this franchise.

Sixth. The rate of fare for any distance along said road shall at no time exceed five cents within the limits of said city for one passenger.

Seventh. The owner of said road shall pay to the city of San Diego such a license for each car as may be required by any ordinance of said city.

Eighth. Said road shall be commenced within four months, and be fully completed, equipped, stocked and in running order within eighteen months after the passage and publication of this ordinance. And the failure to comply with the terms of this condition shall work a forfeiture of all the uncompleted portion of said road.

Sec. 4. The city, in granting this franchise, expressly reserves the right to grade, renew, sewer, pave, macadamize, improve, alter or repair all or either of said streets, or any part thereof, or to lay down, or to permit any other person or company to lay down pipes for water, gas or other purposes, such work to be done so as to obstruct or injure said road as little as possible; the owners of said road shall shift and re-shift their road-bed and rails so as to avoid obstructions made thereby.

Sec. 5. And failure of said grantees, or his assigns, to construct, maintain or manage said road as required by this ordinance, or to comply with any of the requirements and conditions hereof, is hereby made unlawful, and for any such failure or other violation of any of the requirements or conditions of this ordinance, said grantees shall pay to the city of San Diego not less than \$25 nor more than \$300, to be recovered in an action in the name of said city.

An Ordinance granting to the Electric Rapid Transit Street Car Company, a corporation, assignees of L. F. Francisco and David Gouchenauer, a franchise for the construction and operation of a Street Railroad in the city of San Diego, and repealing all parts of Ordinances No 42, and 52, in conflict herewith, is read and on motion of Trustee M'Rae, seconded by Trustee Woolman is referred to the Street Committee and submitted to the City Attorney.

An Ordinance to amend Ordinance No 13, passed August 9th, 1886, entitled "An Ordinance granting to James McCoy and George Neale a franchise for the construction and operation of a Street Railroad in the city of San Diego, is read, and on motion of Trustee Woolman, seconded by Trustee Julian is referred to the Street Committee and submitted to the City Attorney.

The City Attorney reports that Ordinance granting the San Diego Street Car Co, the right to use Arctic Street, between D and K streets is in proper form, also the Ordinance granting the California Central Railroad Company the right to use Atlantic Street, is in proper form.

Messrs C. S. Hamilton and G. F. Judson appears before the Board and protests against the granting of the petitions of the San Diego Street Car Co, and the California Central Railroad Co,

The Street Committee asks for further time to report in the matter of the petitions of the San Diego St. Car Co, and the California Central Railroad Co, On motion of Trustee Woolman, second by Trustee Julian the request is granted,

Mr E. W. Britt appears before the Board and asks to be heard in the matter of the application of Wm Jorres for a franchise to construct a wharf. The Harbor and Wharf Committee states that it is not ready to report upon the system of wharfs and asks for further time, and that the hearing of Mr Jorres be deferred until the report is made. On motion the request is granted.

Mr C. L. Sherman appears before the Board and states that he is unable to collect his pay for numbering the house in the City, and ask the Board to take some action in the matter,

On motion of Trustee Julian, seconded by Trustee McRae, the City Attorney is instructed to draw up an Ordinance compelling the numbering of houses within the limits ordered to be numbered.

 SECTION 1. No person shall ride or drive or cause to be ridden or driven over the Iron Bridge at Old Town, in said city, any horse, mule, or neat cattle at a speed faster than a walk.  
 SEC. 2. Any person violating this ordinance shall upon conviction thereof be fined in a sum not exceeding twenty-five nor less than five dollars.  
 SEC. 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication, as required by law.

The following Ordinance is read, and on motion of Trustee Woolman, seconded by Trustee Julian, is passed, approved, adopted and ordered published by the following vote: Trustee Julian yea; Trustee Woolman nay; Trustee McRae nay; Trustee Valle yea; Trustee Hamilton yea. Said ordinance being in words and figures as follows, to wit:

ORDINANCE NO. 87.

An Ordinance imposing Municipal License upon certain persons, and imposing penalties for the violation thereof:

THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE CITY of San Diego do ordain as follows:  
 SECTION 1. It is hereby declared a misdemeanor for any person or persons, without having first obtained a license therefor, to engage in selling any medicine, implement, appliance or merchandise, or to advertise any physician, quack, surgeon, dentist or other person or business call-

ing or vocation by crying the same, singingsongs, making addresses, telling anecdotes, jokes, etc., or performing instrumental music upon any of the public streets or places of the city of San Diego, from any carriage, wagon, platform, or otherwise, without first having obtained a license therefor.  
 SEC. 2. The license hereby imposed shall be twenty dollars per month, payable invariably in advance.  
 SEC. 3. Every person violating this ordinance shall, on conviction, be fined in a sum not less than fifty nor more than one hundred dollars.  
 SEC. 4. It shall be the duty of the City Marshal and of every policeman to arrest without warrant any person or persons whom they shall find violating this ordinance.  
 SEC. 5. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication as required by law.

The following Ordinance is read, and on motion of Trustee McRae, seconded by Trustee Julian, is passed, approved, adopted and ordered published by the following vote: Trustee McRae yea; Trustee Julian yea; Trustee Valle yea; Trustee Hamilton yea; Trustee Woolman yea. Said ordinance being in words and figures as follows, to wit:

ORDINANCE NO. 88.

An ordinance regulating the width of sidewalk pavements and the dimensions of curbs, gutters, crossings and culverts, and the materials of which they may be constructed.

THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE CITY of San Diego do ordain as follows:  
 SECTION 1. Sidewalk pavements on all streets and parts of streets, except such streets as lie between Third and Eighth streets, and between C street and the water front, inclusive, shall be not less than five feet and four inches in width, and the center line of such pavement shall be the center line of the sidewalk as established by ordinance.

SEC. 2. That gutters along the fronts of lots, and crosswalks across streets shall not be less than three feet in width.  
 SEC. 3. That culverts at the crossings of intersecting streets shall be at least eight inches high by twenty inches wide in the clear, inside measurement.  
 SEC. 4. That sidewalk curbs shall extend from curb grade to at least four inches below the grade of the gutter.  
 SEC. 5. That all sidewalk pavements, curbs, gutters, crossings and culverts provided for in this ordinance may be constructed of wood or any durable substance of such kind and dimensions of material as will be satisfactory to the City Engineer, and they shall be constructed according to plans and specifications prepared by him and on file in his office.  
 SEC. 6. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication as required by law.

The following Ordinance fixing the place of meetings of the Board, is read and on motion of Trustee Julian, seconded by

Trustee Valle, is passed, approved, adopted and ordered published by the following vote: Trustee Julian yea; Trustee McRae yea; Trustee Valle yea; Trustee Woolman yea; Trustee Hamilton yea. Said ordinance being in words and figures as follows, to wit:

**ORDINANCE NO. 89.**

An ordinance fixing the place for holding the meetings of the Board of Trustees of the City of San Diego.

**THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE CITY**

of San Diego do ordain as follows:  
SECTION 1. That from and after June 23d, 1887, the place of meeting of the Board of City Trustees of the city of San Diego shall be the rooms provided therefor in the City's Fire Engine Building on Third street between D and E streets in said city.

SEC. 2. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

SEC. 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication as required by law.

An Ordinance granting leave to the San Diego Street Car Company to lay its track on Arctic street.

**THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE CITY**

of San Diego do ordain as follows:  
SECTION 1. The San Diego Street Car Company, a corporation organized under the laws of the state of California, shall have, and is hereby granted the right to lay its track upon and over Arctic street between D street and Commercial—known as H street—so as to connect its said road upon D street with its said branch road on H street, and to use and occupy the same for the life

of said corporation as specified in its said charter. Subject, however, to all restrictions, conditions and terms specified in the ordinance heretofore passed and published, granting said San Diego Street Car Company the right to use and occupy certain streets in the city of San Diego for its said purposes.

SEC. 2. That portion of ordinance No. 130, of old series, passed and approved March 17, 1886, granting right of way for a street railway to Milton Santee and others, over and along Atlantic street, is hereby repealed.

SEC. 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication, and after its acceptance by San Diego Street Car Company, and not before such acceptance of the repealing clause embraced in section 2 of this ordinance.

The following Ordinance granting the California Central Railroad Company the right to lay its track upon and along Atlantic Street is read and on motion of Trustee Julian, seconded by Trustee Woolman, is passed, approved, adopted and ordered published by the following vote: Trustee Julian yea; Trustee Woolman yea; Trustee McRae yea; Trustee Valle yea; Trustee Hamilton yea. Said ordinance being in words and figures as follows, to wit:

**ORDINANCE NO. 91.**

An Ordinance granting the California Central Railroad Company the right to lay its track upon and along Atlantic street.

**THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE CITY**

of San Diego do ordain as follows:  
WHEREAS, the California Central Railroad Company, a corporation organized under the laws of the State of California, has petitioned this Board to be permitted to lay down its track upon Atlantic street, in this city, for the purpose of approaching to and upon its wharf at the foot of Atlantic street, commonly known as Babcock & Story wharf;

Now therefore, the petition of the said railroad company is granted, and the said California Central Railroad Company is hereby authorized and empowered to lay down its track upon and use the said Atlantic street, the center of its said track to be not less than twenty-six feet six inches from the western line of said street, between C street and the foot of Atlantic street aforesaid, and upon said wharf, and to use the same during the term of its corporate existence. Subject, however, to all the conditions and restrictions provided by law to be made in such cases, and that said track shall be laid under the direction of the City Engineer, and that it shall keep its said track and the spaces between the same and the sides thereof filled, graveled or paved in the manner provided by an ordinance heretofore passed by this Board, permitting the San Diego Central Railroad Company to lay its track upon said Atlantic street; and the President is hereby directed to sign this ordinance and have it published as required by law in such cases.

The following Ordinance granting to the Electric Rapid Transit Street Car Co, a franchise for a street railroad, is read and on motion of Trustee Woolman, seconded by Trustee Julian, is passed, approved, adopted and ordered published by the following vote: Trustee McRae yea; Trustee Woolman yea; Trustee Julian yea; Trustee Valle yea; Trustee Hamilton yea, said ordinance being in words and figures as follows, to wit:

**ORDINANCE NO. 92.**

An Ordinance granting to the Electric Rapid Transit Street Car Company, a corporation, assigns of C. F. Francisco and David Goehener, a franchise for the construction and operation of a street railroad in the city of San Diego, and repealing all parts of ordinances No. 42 and 52, in conflict herewith.

THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE CITY OF San Diego do ordain as follows, to-wit:

SECTION 1. That the right of way be and the same is hereby granted to the Electric Rapid Transit Street Car Company, assigns of C. F. Francisco and David Goehener and their assigns, over and along the public streets of the city of San Diego, for the period of thirty years from and after the adoption of this ordinance, for the purpose of constructing, laying down and maintaining a line of street railroad track with iron and steel rails, with its necessary turnouts and switches, and running cars thereon to be propelled by electricity, conducted, carried or transmitted by wires or conductors over or underground.

SEC. 2. The line of said railroad shall be as follows, upon the following streets: Beginning at the water front at the foot of G street and running thence on G street to Twenty-first street; on B street to the middle of block 1,151. On Third street from water front to G street; on A street from Third street to Fourteenth street; on Fourth street from G street to Palm street; on Palm street one block east to Fifth street; thence north on Fifth street to a point just north of the south line of pueblo lot 1,123; thence east one block to Sixth street, in Crittenden's addition; thence north on Sixth street to Robinson street; thence east on Robinson street to the east line of Crittenden's addition, thence by the most practicable route through the east half of pueblo lot 1,124 and lots 1,117, 1,116, 1,115 and 1,114 to the ex-Mission line.

On Seventeenth street from G street to I street; on I street from Seventeenth street east through pueblo lots 1,155, 1,154, 1,153 and 1,152; and thence through a certain large ravine in Mount Hope Cemetery, nearly on a line with I street to the ex-Mission line.

On Twenty-fifth street from B street to Twenty-third street, in Mannasse & Schiller's addition; thence along Twenty-third street to the depot grounds of the California Southern Railroad Company.

SEC. 3. The above franchises and privileges are granted on the following conditions:

1. Said road shall be constructed throughout its entire length in the center of the streets along or over which it passes, or as near thereto as practicable, provided that the Board of Trustees may at

any time order and require any changes to be made in the lines of said road where switches and turnouts are located.

2. Said road shall be constructed with such a rail as shall be previously approved by the Board of Trustees and in such manner as to cause the least possible obstruction to the use of said streets.

3. Said grantees and assigns shall plank, pave or macadamize the entire length of said route between the rails and for two feet on each side thereof, to correspond with said streets when the same shall be paved or macadamized, and shall keep the same constantly in good repair, flush with the grade of the street, or the natural surface of the streets between the rails, and for four feet on each side thereof, whether said streets are paved or macadamized or not, and provided with good crossings for all kinds of vehicles, and with all necessary and proper flumes and culverts for the free and uninterrupted passage of water under said track. The track shall be four feet eight and one-half inches between the rails, and there shall be a space between the main tracks and side tracks, turnouts and switches sufficient to allow cars to pass each other freely and without danger. And where said streets are not paved or macadamized, said track shall be graded by a plank on each side of the rails, not less than eight inches wide, and which shall be grooved and fitted closely to the rail, and must not be more than three-fourths of an inch below the top of the rail. Provided, however, that whenever the line of route herein permitted to be constructed shall be along any street whereupon the right to construct any other street or other railroad has heretofore been granted, it is upon the express condition that the grantees herein named shall pay an equal proportion of the cost of constructing said railroad.

4. The laying of said track and all side tracks, switches or turnouts shall conform in all cases where the grade of any of said streets has been established and such street graded to such grade, and in all other cases as near to the natural grade of said streets as practicable; and when at any time any part of the route shall be graded, or the grade thereof changed or altered by the Board of Trustees, the bed of the road and the tracks thereof shall be made to conform therewith. Provided that no switch shall be constructed or maintained within fifty feet of any cross-street, and the location of such switches or turnouts shall be changed at the cost of the holder of this franchise whenever so ordered by the Board of Trustees.

Provided, also, that wherever suspended wires or conductors are used they shall be stretched and maintained at an elevation of not less than twenty feet above the grade of the street, and the poles from which such wires or conductors are suspended shall not be erected nearer to each other than a continuous line than one hundred and fifty feet, and shall be of uniform size and height, neatly painted and at nearly equal distances from each other as practicable; and all underground wires or conductors shall be placed in the ground at such depth as shall be determined by the City Engineer; and all wires or conductors shall be placed so as to insure the safety of the public.

Provided, also, that no current of electricity shall ever be conducted or transmitted through, along or over any wires or conductors which shall be dangerous to the life of persons or animals, and that all excavations for sinking wires or conductors or for other purposes shall be refilled, and the earth re-

placed so as to render the surface of the earth in the same condition as before excavating.

5. Said road shall be constructed under the direction and supervision of the City Engineer, who shall, under the direction of the Board of Trustees, designate the rate of curves to be used in surveying the lines of the road from one street to another, where it is necessary to change the directions of sidings or switches, and shall give the established grade of streets along the line, and on the construction of said road, shall set grade stakes along the line indicating the grade of said streets and shall have general supervision of the construction and future maintenance of the road, and to see that the same is constructed and maintained in conformity to the terms and requirements of this ordinance. And for the services rendered by the City Engineer, as herein required, he shall receive such fees as are customary for such services, and the same shall be paid by the holder of this franchise.

6. The rate of fare for any distance along said road shall at no time exceed five cents within the limits of said city for one passenger.

7. The owner of said road shall pay to the city of San Diego such license for each car as may be required by any ordinance of said city.

8. Four miles of said railway shall be completed before the end of the year 1887, and at least four additional miles thereof every year thereafter, and all of said road to be fully completed, stocked, equipped and in running order within thirty months after the passage and publication of this ordinance. Any failure to comply with the conditions of this subdivision shall work a forfeiture of all the uncompleted portion of said road.

SEC. 4. The city, in granting this franchise, expressly reserves the right to grade, renew, sewer, pave, macadamize, improve after or repair all or either of said streets or any part thereof, or to lay down or permit any other person or company to lay down pipes for water, gas or other purposes, such work to be done so as to obstruct or injure said road as little as possible. The owners of said road shall shift and re-shift their roadbed and rails so as to avoid obstructions made thereby.

SEC. 5. And failure of said grantee or its assigns to construct, maintain or manage said road as required by this ordinance, or to comply with any of the requirements or conditions hereof, is hereby made unlawful, and for any such failure or other violation of any of the requirements or conditions of this ordinance, said grantee shall pay to the city of San Diego not less than twenty-five nor more than three hundred dollars, to be recovered in an action in the name of said city.

SEC. 6. The Electric Rapid Transit Street Car Company is hereby granted and is licensed and permitted to operate street cars or street railways wherever franchises therefor have been or may hereafter be granted, upon making contracts therefor with the owners of such franchises, by means of electricity carried or transmitted by wires or conductors under and according to the conditions of such franchises, and under the terms, conditions and restriction of this ordinance.

SEC. 7. All sections or subdivisions of sections of Ordinance No. 42, passed, approved and adopted, January 3, 1887, and of Ordinance No. 52, passed, approved and adopted, February 14, 1887, in conflict with the provisions of the foregoing ordinance or granting other streets than herein designated, are hereby repealed.

Communications <sup>are read</sup> from Mr Bryant Howard in regard to amending Sec 5 of Ordinance No 60. making a levy for twenty years for the payment of Sewer Bonds and Interest, also that the word order in the bonds should be changed to bearer.

The following Ordinance amending Sec 5 of Ordinance No 60. is read and on motion of Trustee McRae, seconded by Trustee Valle is passed, approved, adopted and ordered published by the following vote: Trustee McRae yea; Trustee Valle yea; Trustee Julian yea; Trustee Hamilton yea; Trustee Woolman absent. Said ordinance being in words <sup>and</sup> figures as follows, to wit:

## Ordinance No 93.

An Ordinance amending Section 5 of Ordinance No 60, passed, approved and adopted the 14th. day of March 1887, entitled "An Ordinance providing for creating an indebtedness of Four hundred thousand dollars for the construction of sewers in the City of San Diego, California, and for the issue

ance of bonds therefor, and for the levying and collection of taxes for the payment of said bonds and interest thereon."

The Board of Trustees of the City of San Diego do ordain as follows:

That section 5 of said ordinance no 60 be and the same is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

Section 5. The Board of Trustees of said City hereby levies an annual tax for the next twenty years upon all the real and personal property subject to taxation within said City, in addition to the levy authorized for other purposes amounting to the sum of Thirty two thousand and ninety seven and ten one hundredths dollars for each of the said twenty years, for the purpose of paying the interest and redemption of the said bonds, and the same shall be assessed and collected in the same manner as other taxes in said City are assessed and collected, and the money arising from such levy shall be known as "The Sewer Bond Fund" and shall be used for the payment of said bonds and interest coupons and for no other purpose whatever; and the Treasurer shall open and keep in his books as a separate, and special account thereof, which shall at all times show the exact condition of said bond fund. All of said money so raised above the amount necessary to pay the interest on said bonds shall be known as the "Sinking Fund" for the payment of said bonds.

Mr Wm H. Dickinson appears before the Board and makes application to have Ordinance No 51, granting a franchise for a Street Railroad, amended granting the right to run said Railroad on 6th, 9 and 7th Streets, also presenting an Ordinance therefor which is read and on motion of Trustee M' Rae, seconded by Trustee Julian is referred to the Street Committee and City Attorney.

Hitchcock presents and reads a communication from the Board of Education, urging the necessity of more School building, and that a bonded indebtedness of some \$50,000 is now requisite to put the City in condition to provide school accommodations for the present and near future &c, to secure which the speedy and

Therefore, the Board of Trustees of the City of San Diego, California, hereby declares its intention to grade said 16<sup>th</sup> Street, including the sidewalks thereof, and the entire crossings of said 16<sup>th</sup> Street with the streets intersecting the same from ~~the~~ 150 feet south of the south side of N Street to the

South line of the City Park, in the City of San Diego, according to the <sup>as established by ordinance</sup> ~~established~~ grade of said street, said sidewalks and crossings except the crossings of said 16<sup>th</sup> Street at its intersections with F, G, H & K Streets, said streets having already been graded. And the Superintendent of streets is hereby required to post, and caused to be published in the San Diego Union, a daily newspaper printed and published in said City, notice thereof according to law.

In the matter of constructing sidewalks, curbs, crosswalks, gutters and culverts on H Street. The following Resolution is read and on motion of Trustee Julian, seconded by Trustee Valle is passed, approved and adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board present; to wit:

Be it Resolved by the Board of Trustees of the City of San Diego, that the Public interest and convenience require the construction of sidewalks, curbs, crosswalks, gutters and culverts along both sides of "H" Street, from the West line of Atlantic Street to the West side of Twenty-fifth Street.

Therefore the Board of Trustees of the City of San Diego, California, hereby declares its intention to place sidewalks, curbs, crosswalks, gutters and culverts along both sides of "H" Street; except where they are already built; from the West side of Atlantic Street to the West side of 25<sup>th</sup> Street as follows, to wit:

Sec 1. The sidewalks, curbs, crosswalks, gutters and culverts shall be made of wood according to plans and specifications on file in the City Engineers Office.

Sec. 2. The width of the sidewalk pavements shall be full width between 3<sup>rd</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> streets and the rest of the distance they shall be five feet four inches in width,

Sec 3. Crosswalks and gutters shall be three feet wide.

Sec 4. Curbs and culverts shall be built according to ordinance.

Sec 5. And be it understood that in all cases where the owner wishes to construct a full width sidewalk where a sidewalk pavement of less width is required, or wishes it or any of the required work constructed of ~~any~~ other and better material, he can do so, and he will be assessed the regular assessment made to cover the work done under this resolution, and he must also pay all extra expenses that the extra work requires. And the Superintendent of Streets

is hereby required to post, and cause to be published in the San Diego Union, a daily newspaper printed and published in said City, notice thereof according to law.

On motion of Trustee Julian, seconded by Trustee Valle the President of the Board is instructed to appoint a Committee to confer with the Health Officer in the matter of a place to move the Pest House. The President appoints as such Committee Trustees Julian and Valle.

THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE CITY of San Diego do ordain as follows: That section 1 of said Ordinance No. 60 be and the same is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

On D street between Fourteenth and Fifteenth streets, and between Sixteenth and Seventeenth streets.

On E street between Thirteenth and Sixteenth streets.

On F street between Fourteenth and Fifteenth streets.

On G street between Fourteenth and Fifteenth streets; also between Twenty-second and Twenty-third streets.

On H street between Atlantic and State streets; also between Fourteenth and Fifteenth streets, and between Sixteenth and Nineteenth streets; also between Twenty-second and Twenty-fourth streets.

On I street between State and First streets; also between Fourteenth and Fifteenth streets, and between Nineteenth and Twentieth streets; also between Twenty-second and Twenty-fourth streets.

On J street between First and Third streets, and between Fourteenth and Fifteenth streets;

also between Twenty-second and Twenty-fourth streets.

On K street between Third and Fifth streets, and between Fourteenth and Fifteenth streets; also between Twenty-second and Twenty-fourth streets.

On L street between Fifth and Sixteenth streets; also between Twenty-second and Twenty-fourth streets.

On M street between Seventh and Eighth streets; also between Sixteenth and Seventeenth streets, and between Twenty-second and Twenty-fourth streets.

On N street between water front and Sixteenth street; also between Seventeenth and Twenty-fourth streets.

And also running from the intersection of Atlantic and H streets into the waters of the Bay of San Diego two and one-half miles in a north-westerly direction to Beacon No. 5, as established by the United States survey of the harbor of San Diego, the route of said sewers to run from and to the center of the said street.

The same to be constructed of brick, and of iron and clay pipes, as follows, to-wit:  
172,620 feet of 6 inch clay pipe.  
20,690 feet of 8 inch clay pipe.  
4,810 feet of 10 inch clay pipe.  
1,580 feet of 12 inch clay pipe.  
3,050 feet of 15 inch clay pipe.  
1,030 feet of 18 inch clay pipe.  
6,780 feet of 24 inch brick sewer.

And the balance thereof of iron pipe of not to exceed 36 inches in diameter, shall be created by the issuance of bonds of said city in a sum of one thousand dollars each, and shall draw interest at the rate of five per cent per annum, payable semi-annually, and to run for twenty years, but subject to payment at any time, at the pleasure of said city, which bonds shall be substantially in the following form:

## "SEWER BOND."

No. — The city of San Diego, in the State of California, for value received, promise to pay

— or bearer, at the office of the Treasurer of said city, in said city, on the 1st day of April, 1887, or at any time before that date, at the pleasure of the said city, the sum of one thousand dollars, lawful money of the United States, with interest at the rate of five per cent per annum, payable at the office of said Treasurer semi-annually, on the first days of March and September in each year, on presentation and surrender of the interest coupon hereto attached.

This bond is issued by the Board of Trustees of the city of San Diego in conformity with an Ordinance duly passed by said Board on the 14th day of March, 1887, and under authority conferred upon said Board by the provisions of an act of the Legislature of the State of California, entitled "An act to provide for work upon the streets, alleys, courts, places and sidewalks, and for the construction of sewers within municipalities," approved March 13, 1885.

In testimony whereof, the said city, by its Board of Trustees, has caused this bond to be signed by the President of said Board of Trustees, and also the Treasurer of said city, with the city seal affixed, this 1st day of April, 1887.

An Ordinance granting the San Diego and Old Town Street Railway Co, the right of way to construct and maintain a line of Street Railroad track, commencing in the center of C Street where it is crossed by Artic Avenue, thence on C Street to the center of 1<sup>st</sup> street, thence along 1<sup>st</sup> Street to the center

of F street, thence along F street to 6<sup>th</sup> street, is read and on motion of Trustee McRae, seconded by Trustee Valle is referred to the Street Committee and City Attorney.

The following Ordinance is read and on motion of Trustee McRae, seconded by Trustee Julian is passed, approved, adopted and ordered published by the following vote; Trustee Julian yea; Trustee McRae yea; Trustee Valle yea; Trustee Woolman yea; Trustee Hamilton yea. Said Ordinance being in words and figures as follows, to wit;

#### ORDINANCE NO. 98.

THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE CITY of San Diego do ordain as follows:

SECTION 1. That the right of way be and the same is hereby granted to San Diego and Old Town Street Railway Company and their successors or assigns, over and along the public streets of said city named in this Ordinance, for the period of thirty years from and after the adoption of this ordinance, for the purpose of constructing, laying down and maintaining a line of street railroad track, with iron and steel rails, with its necessary turnouts and switches, and running cars thereon to be drawn by horses, steam or other power authorized by law. Provided, That the use of steam as a propelling power may be prohibited by order of the Board of Trustees at any time in their discretion, and provided, further, that such steam power shall not be used for any other purpose than that of propelling street cars.

SEC. 2. The line of said railroad shall be as follows: Commencing at the termination of the San Diego and Old Town Street Railway an Arctic street, and running thence along Arctic street to H street, and thence along H street to the ferry.

SEC. 3. The above franchise and privileges are granted on the following conditions:

First. Said road shall be constructed throughout its entire length through the center of the streets along or over which it passes, or as near thereto as practicable, provided, that the Board of Trustees may at any time order and require any changes to be made in the line of said road where switches and turnouts are located.

Second. Said road shall be constructed with such a rail as shall be previously approved by the Board of Trustees, and in such manner as to cause the least possible obstruction to the use of said streets.

Third. Said grantees, or their assigns, shall plank, pave or macadamize the entire length of said route between the rails, and for two feet on each side thereof, to correspond with said streets

when the same shall be paved or macadamized, and shall keep the same constantly in good repair, flush with the grade of the streets, or the natural surface of the streets between the rails, and for four feet on each side thereof, whether said streets are paved or macadamized or not, and provided with good crossings for all kinds of vehicles, and with all necessary and proper flumes and culverts for the free and uninterrupted passage of water under said track. The track shall be four feet eight and one-half inches between the rails, and there shall be a space between the main tracks and side tracks, turnouts and switches sufficient to allow cars to pass each other freely and without danger. And where said streets are now paved or macadamized said track shall be girded by a plank on each side of the rails, not less than eight inches wide, and which shall be grooved and fitted closely to the rail, and must not be more than three-fourths of an inch below the top of the rail.

Fourth. The laying of said track and all side tracks, switches or turnouts shall conform in all cases where the grade of any of said streets has been established and such streets graded to such grade, and in all other cases as near to the natural grade of said streets as practicable, and when at any time any part of the route shall be graded, or the grade thereof changed or altered by the Board of Trustees, the bed of the road and tracks thereof shall be made to conform therewith. Provided, That no switch shall be constructed or maintained within fifty feet of any cross street, and the location of such switches or turnouts shall be changed at the cost of the holder of this franchise whenever so ordered by the Board of Trustees.

Fifth. Said road shall be constructed under the direction and supervision of the City Engineer, who shall, under the direction of the Board of Trustees, designate the direction of curves to be used in surveying the lines of said road from one street to another, where it is necessary to change the direction of sidings or switches, and shall give the established grade of the streets along the line, and on the construction of said road, shall set grade-stakes along the line indicating the grade of said streets, and shall have general supervision of the construction and future maintenance of

the road, and to see that the same is constructed and maintained in conformity to the terms and requirements of this ordinance. And for the services rendered by the City Engineer, as herein required, he shall receive such fees as are customary for such services, and the same shall be paid by the holder of this franchise.

Sixth. The rate of fare for any distance along said road shall at no time exceed five cents for one passage, and transfers shall be given for all roads running within one hundred feet of said road without extra charge, for one single ride over all the routes of this franchise, and those of any other street railroad for one single ride, not exceeding one mile, on such other road.

Seventh. The owners of said road shall pay to the city of San Diego such a license for each car as may be required by any ordinance of said city.

Eighth. Said road shall be commenced within six months, and be fully completed, equipped, stocked and in running order within one year after the passage and publication of this ordinance. And the failure to comply with the terms of this condition shall work a forfeiture of all rights and privileges granted by this ordinance.

SEC. 4. The city, in granting this franchise, expressly reserves the right to grade, renew, sewer, pave, macadamize, improve, alter or repair all or either of said streets, or any part thereof, or to lay down, or to permit any other person or company to lay down pipes for water, gas or other purposes, such work to be done so as to obstruct or injure said road as little as possible; the owners of said road shall shift and re-shift their road bed and rails so as to avoid obstructions made thereby.

SEC. 5. Any failure of said grantees, or their assigns, to construct, maintain or manage said road as required by this ordinance, or to comply with any of the requirements and conditions hereof, is hereby made unlawful, and for any such failure or other violation of any of the requirements or conditions of this ordinance, said grantees shall pay to the city of San Diego not less than \$25 nor more than \$300, to be recovered in an action in the name of said city.

#### ORDINANCE NO. 99.

An Ordinance granting a franchise to the California Central Railway Company, to use lands, waters and certain streets in the city of San Diego, for the purpose of its necessary works.

THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE CITY of San Diego do ordain as follows:  
SECTION 1. That the California Central Railway Company, its successors and assigns, be and is hereby permitted to use such lands and waters in the city of San Diego as it now has, or may hereafter acquire and require for the purpose of a steam railroad (which it proposes to forthwith construct), and its depots, repairing shops, offices, tracks, sidings, switches and other works; subject, however, to all rights of private ownership affected by the same, to be acquired by purchase or condemnation, as provided by law.  
SECTION 2. That the said California Central Railway Company, its successors and assigns, be and it is hereby authorized to use, for the purpose of its main line or track, with its necessary sidings or switches, and for the term of fifty years from the day of its incorporation, the following streets and highways within the said city of San Diego:  
SECTION 3. The streets and highways over and in respect of which the said right is to be deemed granted are as follows: Commencing at a point

where the center of Twenty-second street intersects the north line of the "depot grounds" of the California Southern Railroad Company, and running thence along the center of said Twenty-second street to a point necessary to curve so as to reach the center of N street, thence along the center of N street to Thirty-second street, and thence along the center of Thirty-second street to a point near H street.

SECTION 4. The conditions to which the enjoyment of said right is to be deemed subject are as follows:

First. The said line or track shall, when laid along said streets, or either of them, be laid along the center thereof, except when the same curves from Twenty-second street to N street, and except when the same curves from N street to Thirty-second street.

Second. That the laying of said track shall conform in all cases, when the grade of any such street has been established, to such established grade; and, in all other cases, to the natural grade of such streets, and when, at any time, any part of the road shall be graded, or the grade thereof be altered or changed by the Board of City Trustees, or its successors, the bed of the road and the tracks thereof shall be made to conform to such altered grades. The City Engineer, under the instructions of the Board of Trustees, but at the cost of the grantee of this franchise, shall give the established grades when required, and, on the construction of the said road, shall set grade stakes along the line thereof, indicating the grade of the street in such a manner that the track may be placed in accordance therewith.

Third. The holders of this franchise shall, as said tracks are put down, macadamize that part of the street between the rails, and for four feet on

each side of said tracks, and keep the same in constant good repair.

Fourth. The holders of this franchise shall plank, pave or macadamize the entire length of said route between the rails and for four feet on each side thereof, to correspond with said streets, when the same shall be planked, paved or macadamized, and shall constantly keep the same in good repair, flush with the grade of the streets, or the natural surface of the streets for four feet on each side thereof, whether said streets are paved or macadamized, or not, and provided with good crossings for all kinds of vehicles, and with all necessary flumes and culverts for the free and uninterrupted passage of water under said tracks.

Fifth. The regulation of the reasonable use of said streets by the holders of this franchise shall always be under the supervision of the Board of Trustees of said city. The city of San Diego reserves the right to the use of all of said streets, except that portion actually occupied by said railroad track.

SECTION 5. No train, carriage, car or engine shall travel the said streets at a greater rate of speed than six miles per hour.

SECTION 6. The city, in making the grant of this franchise, expressly reserves the right to grade, sewer, renew, pave, macadamize, improve, alter or repair all or either of said streets, or any part thereof, and to lay down pipes for water, gas and other purposes; such work to be done by the city, so as to obstruct or injure said road as little as possible. The holder of this franchise shall shift and reshift said road bed and rails so as to avoid obstruction thereby.

Trustees McRae and Valle are excused from further attendance of this meeting.

An application from the San Diego Lumber Company for a wharf franchise, <sup>also affidavits of publishing and posting notice of intention of application for said franchise.</sup> is presented by attorney Henderson and on motion of Trustee McRae, seconded by Trustee Valle it is referred to the City Attorney and Harbor and Wharf Committee.

A communication from Mr J. J. Dunn <sup>is read, asking</sup> that he be allowed to use Oregon pine instead of yellow leaf pine in the construction of the sewer reservoir, and offering to make a reduction of \$500<sup>00</sup> on his contract for constructing the reservoir. On motion of Trustee McRae, seconded by Trustee Julian it is ordered that the proposition of Mr Dunn be accepted and he be allowed to use Oregon pine.

Said Ordinance being in words and figures as follows, to wit:

#### ORDINANCE NO. 100.

THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE CITY of San Diego do ordain as follows:

SECTION 1. That the right of way be and the same is hereby granted to San Diego and Old Town Street Railway Company and their successors or assigns, over and along the public streets of said city named in this ordinance, for the period of thirty years from and after the adoption of this ordinance, for the purpose of constructing, laying down and maintaining a line of street railroad track, with iron or steel rails, with its necessary turnouts and switches, and running cars thereon to be drawn by horse, cable, electric, or other power authorized by law. Provided, that the use of steam as a propelling power may be prohibited by order of the Board of Trustees at any time in their discretion, and provided, further, that such steam power shall not be used for any other purpose than that of propelling street cars.

SEC. 2. The line of said railroad shall be as follows: Commencing in the center of E street where it is crossed by Arctic avenue, and running thence up E street to the center of First street, thence along First street to the center of F street, thence along F street to Sixth street.

SEC. 3. The above franchise and privileges are granted on the following conditions:

First. Said road shall be constructed throughout its entire length through the center of the streets along or over which it passes, or as near thereto as practicable, provided, that the Board of Trustees may at any time order and require any changes to be made in the line of said road where switches and turnouts are located.

Second. Said road shall be constructed with such a rail as shall be previously approved by the Board of Trustees, and in such manner as to cause the least possible obstruction to the use of said streets.

Third. Said grantees, or their assigns, shall plank, pave or macadamize the entire length of said route between the rails, and for two feet on each side thereof, to correspond with said streets

when the same shall be paved or macadamized, and shall keep the same constantly in good repair, flush with the grade of the streets, or the natural surface of the streets between the rails, and for four feet on each side thereof, whether said streets are paved or macadamized or not, and provided with good crossings for all kinds of vehicles, and with all necessary and proper flumes and culverts for the free and uninterrupted passage of water under said track. The track shall be four feet eight and one-half inches between the rails, and there shall be a space between the main tracks and side tracks, turnouts and switches sufficient to allow cars to pass each other freely and without danger. And where said streets are now paved or macadamized, said track shall be girded by a plank on each side of the rails, not less than eight inches wide, and which shall be grooved and fitted closely to the rail, and must not be more than three-fourths of an inch below the top of the rail.

Fourth. The laying of said track and all side tracks, switches or turnouts shall conform in all cases where the grade of any of said streets has been established and such streets graded to such grade, and in all other cases as near to the natural grade of said streets as practicable, and when at any time any part of the route shall be graded, or the grade thereof changed or altered by the Board of Trustees, the bed of the road and tracks thereof shall be made to conform therewith. Provided, That no switch shall be constructed or maintained within fifty feet of any cross street, and the location of such switches or turnouts shall be changed at the cost of the holders of this franchise whenever so ordered by the Board of Trustees.

Fifth. Said road shall be constructed under the direction and supervision of the City Engineer, who shall, under the direction of the Board of Trustees, designate the rate of curves to be used in surveying the lines of said road from one street to another, where it is necessary to change the direction of sidings or switches, and shall give the established grade of the streets along the line, and on the construction of said road, shall set grade stakes along the line indicating the grade of said streets, and shall have general supervision of the construction and future maintenance of

the road, and to see that the same is constructed and maintained in conformity to the terms and requirements of this ordinance. And for the services rendered by the City Engineer, as herein required, he shall receive such fees as are customary for such services, and the same shall be paid by the holders of this franchise.

Sixth. The rate of fare for any distance along said road shall at no time exceed five cents for one passenger, and transfers shall be given for all roads running within one hundred feet of said road without extra charge, for one single ride over all the routes of this franchise, and those of any other street railroad for one single ride, not exceeding one mile, on such road.

Seventh. The owners of said road shall pay to the city of San Diego such license for each car as may be required by any ordinance of said city.

Eighth. Said road shall be commenced within thirty days, and be fully completed, equipped, stocked and in running order within six months after the passage and publication of this ordinance. And the failure of the company to comply with the terms of this condition shall work a forfeiture of all rights and privileges granted by this ordinance.

SEC. 4. The city, in granting this franchise, expressly reserves the right to grade, renew, sewer, pave, macadamize, improve, alter or repair all or either of said streets, or any part thereof, or to lay down, or to permit any other person or company to lay down pipes for water, gas or other purposes, such work to be done so as to obstruct or injure said road as little as possible; the owners of said road shall shift and re-shift their road-bed and rails so as to avoid obstructions made thereby.

SEC. 5. Any failure of said grantees, or their assigns, to construct, maintain or manage said road as required by this ordinance, or to comply with any of the requirements or conditions hereof, is hereby made unlawful, and for any such failure or other violation of any of the requirements or conditions of this ordinance, said grantees shall pay to the city of San Diego not less than \$25 nor more than \$300, to be recovered in an action in the name of said city.

D. B. Northrup presents an agreement for Street Sprinkling which is read and on motion of Trustee Julian, seconded by Trustee Woolman is referred to the Street Committee.

#### NOTICE.

##### SEWER WORK.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN THAT Sealed Proposals will be received by the city of San Diego, California, up to the hour of 7 o'clock p. m. on the 25th day of August, 1887, at the room of the Board of Trustees of said city, for the work described in the following specifications, to wit:

Specifications for digging and back-filling sewer trenches in the city of San Diego, in the territory bounded on the south and west by San Diego bay, on the north by Ash street, and on the east by Fifteenth street, including Ash and Fifteenth streets, and excepting First, Second, Third, Seventh, Eighth and Ninth streets. The aggregate length being approximately 100,000 feet.

Depths of cuttings as shown by profiles to be seen at the office of the Resident Engineer of the Sewerage of San Diego.

The trenches to be excavated to and not below a depth two inches above the grade shown by the profile—to be indicated by the engineer as the work progresses. Work shall be begun and carried on at such points and in such manner as the engineer may indicate.

The pipe-laying gangs will fill the trenches to a depth of one foot over the top of the pipe. The contractor is to complete the filling.

All work to be done in accordance with these specifications, to wit: The width of the trench at the bottom to be at least sixteen inches more than the diameter of the pipe to be laid, and the sides of the trench to be given a proper and uniform batter.

Wherever the ground is disposed to cave or slide, it must be supported by proper bracing or sheet piling, as the engineer may direct. When sheet piling is ordered by the engineer to be left in place, it will be paid for at its proper actual cost as an extra. No other lumber will be allowed for in the estimates.

Wherever water is encountered in trenching it is to be removed by contractor, who must provide such pumps, &c., as are necessary to keep water entirely away from pipes until the joints have

set and are covered.

Such portions of the excavated earth as the engineer may indicate, in quality and quantity, shall be thrown to one side of the trench to be used for covering the pipe. The remainder of the excavation will be thrown to the other side of the trench. Under no circumstances are stub or grade pegs to be disturbed or covered.

The trench must not be opened for more than 300 feet in advance of the pipe laying, nor left unfilled more than 100 feet in the rear of the pipe laying.

The work must be carried on at such a rate of speed as to allow the pipe-laying gangs to be uninterrupted in their work. Any delay or overcrowding of these gangs is to be compensated for by such damages, to be paid by the contractor to the city, as the resident engineer may determine to be just.

The contractor must maintain barricades and lights to prevent accidents to passengers in the streets, and must take special precautions to secure the safety of buildings and property near the excavation.

All ordinances relating to such precautions and safeguards must be fully and faithfully observed by the contractor, he holding himself personally amenable for any violation of them by his employees or agents.

In ditching about water and gas pipes special care must be exercised, and if any injury is caused by the carelessness or neglect of any workman the cost of repair is to be deducted by the city from the compensation of the contractor, and should be by him deducted from the wages of such workman.

Back filling to a depth of one foot over the top of the pipe will be done by the pipe-laying gang.

The filling above this depth will be done by the contractor. The earth will be thoroughly rammed in layers, one man ramming for each man filling, or the filling shall be puddled in with water, or both, as the engineer shall direct.

In crossing streets, gutters, crosswalks and other places over which there is a great amount of travel, special attention will be given to making the filling compact, and when the engineer requires it a portion of the street will be planked.

As the work progresses, and at least as fast as the engineer shall direct, all surplus earth, material and rubbish shall be removed from the

street by the contractor at his own expense.

All portions of the work shall be at all times subject to the control of the engineer or his representatives, and all their orders shall be promptly and completely executed.

Ten per cent of the compensation to be paid to the contractor under this agreement shall be retained for such time as the resident engineer shall determine, not exceeding three months from the completion of the work. If during this full period the contractor shall maintain the street in good condition over the filling, this retained money shall be paid to him on the certificate of the resident engineer.

Should the contractor at any time neglect for more than twenty-four hours to make good any defect in the filling, the resident engineer shall have authority to make the same good and to deduct the cost of so doing from the 10 per cent herein provided to be retained from the amount due the contractor.

as Eleventh street; thence north along the center line of Eleventh street to the south line of the Park, thence along the south line of the Park to Sixteenth street.

6. The Fifth Ward of said city shall be all that portion of the city included between the center line of A street and the center line of Grape street, extending to the extension of Sixteenth street in the Park on the east, and ships' channel in the bay on the west.

7. The Sixth Ward of said city shall be all the remaining portion of said city lying north and west of a line extending from the extension of Sixteenth street in the Park, along the center line of Grape street to the ships' channel in the bay, and from thence to the ocean.

An Ordinance establishing the grade of E street, from the west side of Atlantic street to the east side of Sixteenth street, in the city of San Diego, State of California.

THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE CITY of San Diego do ordain as follows:

Section 1. The grade of E street, from the west side of Atlantic street to the east side of Sixteenth street, is hereby established as follows:

The elevations of the points herein named, above the datum line of levels fixed by ordinance No. 3, shall be fixed as follows:

At the southwest corner of E and Atlantic streets, 1.0 feet; at the northwest corner thereof, 1.0 feet; at the southeast corner thereof, 1.0 feet; and at the northeast corner thereof, 1.0 feet.

At the southwest corner of E and California streets, 4.5 feet; at the northwest corner thereof, 4.5 feet; at the southeast corner thereof, 5.5 feet; and at the northeast corner thereof, 5.5 feet.

At the southwest corner of E and Arctic streets, 7.0 feet; at the northwest corner thereof, 7.0 feet; at the southeast corner thereof, 7.5 feet; and at the northeast corner thereof, 7.5 feet.

Sec. 2. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Sec. 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication as required by law.

Mr N.H. Conklin on behalf of Geo. H. Crippen and Frank P. Johnson presents a petition for a franchise to construct, maintain and operate a Street Railroad within the City of San Diego, over and along certain streets and Pueblo Lots, which is read

a drawn Ordinance granting said franchise is also presented which on motion of Trustee of Trustee M' Rae, seconded by Trustee Woolman is referred to the City Attorney.

Trustee Julian came in and took his seat in the Board.

Mr Geo. N. Hitchcock appears before the Board and presents and reads an estimate of expenses for school buildings, furniture and repairs, which should be made at once for the City Schools, amounting to \$60,850<sup>00</sup>. On motion of Trustee M' Rae, seconded by Trustee Julian the matter is referred to the Finance Committee.

The City Attorney presents the following Contract between the City and J. L. Blackmar, which is read and on motion of Trustee Woolman, seconded by Trustee M' Rae is approved and ordered to be entered into, said Contract being as follows, to wit:

This Agreement made this 17<sup>th</sup> day of August 1887 between the City of San Diego and J. L. Blackmar.

Witnesseth:

That for and in consideration of the covenants hereinafter made and set forth on the part of the said J. L. Blackmar, the said City of San Diego by and through its agent and representative M. D. Hamilton, President of the Board of Trustees agrees to sell, and the said J. L. Blackmar agrees to buy gravel in that certain gravel bank situate on the Ocean beach near the mouth of Penasquitas Creek and within the boundary limit of said City, at the rate of fifteen (15) cents per gross ton in the bank.

And the said City further agrees to give the said J. L. Blackmar the right of way over and across its lands adjacent thereto for the purpose of removing said gravel.

The said J. L. Blackmar in consideration of the foregoing covenants on the part of said City, agrees to pay said City for said gravel at the rate of fifteen (15) cents per gross ton in bank for all gravel removed therefrom by him or his agents; and to render and certify monthly accounts for the same to said City.

And the said J. L. Blackmar further agrees to build a rail road switch to said gravel bed and to commence removing

gravel therefrom within six months from date.

This agreement shall be and remain in force three years from and after the 1<sup>st</sup> day of August 1887.

A failure on the part of the said J. D. Blackman to comply with any of the afore said covenants of this agreement shall work a forfeiture thereof.

Mr Vance, Supt. of the Electric Light Co. appears before the Board and states that the Company can not collect enough from the property owners, to maintain the Electric Lights on the Plaza, and unless the City will pay a portion (about \$1800) of the expense the masts will be taken down the 1<sup>st</sup> of September.

On motion of Trustee M<sup>c</sup>Rae, seconded by Trustee Woolman the matter of renaming and the continuation of the streets in the different Additions of the City is referred to the Street Committee and the City Engineer, to report upon at the next meeting of the Board.

under the advertisement inviting sealed proposals for constructing sidewalks, curbs, crosswalks, gutters and culverts along both sides of C street, from the West side of Atlantic Street to the West side of 25th Street in the City of San Diego, that one such proposal has been received, and the same being opened is found to be from S. F. Hoole who proposes to build the sidewalks, gutters, Culverts and crosswalks on C street and furnish all material and labor, in accordance with plans and specifications for said work for the sum of \$45<sup>00</sup> per M. B. M. will grade the sidewalks to the required grade where cutting is required for 10 cents per superficial yard, will excavate for gutter at 10 cents per superficial yard, will excavate for all culverts with a width of 4 feet for \$7<sup>00</sup> each. 3 foot culverts for \$6<sup>00</sup> each, all other culverts \$5<sup>00</sup> each. All surplus earth removed at .50cts per two horse load if moved over 600 feet, under that distance .30 cts, per load, and will finish the improvement inside of sixty working days if require and lumber can be obtained in the City. SEC. 2. That said wharf shall be constructed on land adjacent to and submerged by that piece of navigable water known as the bay of San Diego, in the county aforesaid, and located as follows: Commencing at a point on Atlantic street, in said city of San Diego, where the north line of F street intersects the line of high water in said bay, and running thence south 86 degrees west, 1,920 feet; thence north 49 degrees west, 535 feet; thence south 41 degrees west, 80 feet; thence south 49 degrees east, 500 feet; thence north 88 degrees east, 2,000 feet to the line of high water on said bay; thence north with such line of high water 37½ feet to place of beginning.

SEC. 3. That said applicant shall have and he is hereby granted the right of way and all necessary use for the purposes of said wharf, of all overflowed, submerged or tide lands in the location above described, belonging to the State of California, and which comprises 12,778½ square yards, or thereabouts, together with the right to have, unencumbered and unobstructed, the land

and water on each side of said wharf, from high-water mark to navigable waters, a distance of 150 feet, for convenience in landing, loading and unloading vessels, but for no other purpose.

SEC. 4. That the said wharf shall be constructed of redwood and Oregon pine timber, in a substantial and workmanlike manner and to the satisfaction of this Board of Trustees.

SEC. 5. That said applicant shall commence the construction of said wharf within 100 days from the passage of this ordinance, and that one-half thereof shall be completed within twelve months from the date hereof, and the whole thereof shall be completed within two years from the date of the passage of this ordinance.

SEC. 6. That the said wharf shall not extend (anything contained herein to the contrary notwithstanding) into the water of said bay so far as to obstruct the free navigation of the same.

SEC. 7. That the Clerk of this Board shall make a proper record of this ordinance and cause the same to be published for the time and in the manner required by law.

Said Ordinance being in words and figures as follows, to wit;

ORDINANCE NO. 109.

An Ordinance granting the right to construct and maintain a street railroad in the City of San Diego to George H. Crippen and Frank P. Johnson.

AN APPLICATION HAVING BEEN MADE to the Board of Trustees of the City of San Diego, State of California, by George H. Crippen and Frank P. Johnson, for a franchise, giving them the right to construct and maintain a street railroad along and on certain streets of the city of San Diego; and it appearing that the public good and convenience will be promoted by granting to said parties the rights as prayed for; now therefore, the Board of Trustees of the City of San Diego do ordain as follows: That there is hereby granted to George H. Crippen and Frank P. Johnson the right to construct and maintain a street railroad within the city of San Diego, commencing at the intersection of B Street and California Street, in said city of San Diego, thence northerly on California Street to First Street, thence northerly on First Street to Weatherby Street, thence westerly on Weatherby Street to Horton Street, thence northerly on Horton Street to west boundary of Canal Street tract,

thence westerly across pueblo lands to intersection of Hill and Hayes streets, thence on Hayes Street through Hayes' addition to Commercial Street, thence over pueblo lands to point where Front Street intersects the north line of Manasse & Schiller's subdivision of pueblo lot No. 209, thence southerly on Front Street to Thirtieth (30) Street, thence on Thirtieth Street to Water Street, thence on Water Street to Twenty-eighth Street, thence on Twenty-eighth Street to Main Street, thence on Main Street to south boundary of Roseville, thence across pueblo lands to north end of Kerney Street in La Playa, thence southerly along Kerney Street to the Government Reservation.

This franchise being granted to the said George H. Crippen and Frank P. Johnson upon the following terms and conditions, to-wit:

1. Said road shall be constructed throughout the entire length in the center of the streets along or over which it passes, or as near thereto as practicable; provided, that the Board of Trustees may at any time order and require any changes to be made in the line of said road where switches and turnouts are located.
2. Said road shall be constructed with such a rail as shall be previously approved by the Board of Trustees, and in such a manner as to cause the least possible obstruction to the use of said streets.
3. Said grantees or their assigns shall plank, pave or macadamize the entire length of said route between the rails, and for two feet on each

side thereof, to correspond with said streets when the same shall be paved or macadamized, and shall keep the same constantly in good repair, flush with the grade of the streets, or the natural surface of the streets between the rails, and for four feet on each side thereof, whether said streets are paved or macadamized or not, and provided with good crossings for all kinds of vehicles, and with all necessary and proper flumes and culverts for the free and uninterrupted passage of water under said track. The track shall be four feet eight and one-half inches between the rails, and there shall be a space between the

main tracks and side tracks, turn-outs and switches sufficient to allow cars to pass each other freely and without danger. And where said streets are not paved or macadamized said track shall be girded by a plank on each side of the rails, not less than eight inches wide, and which shall be grooved and fitted closely to the rail and must not be more than three-fourths of an inch below the top of the rail.

4. The laying of said track and all side-tracks, switches or turnouts shall conform in all cases, where the grade of any said streets has been established and such street graded, to such grade, and in all other cases as near to the natural grade of said streets as practicable, and when at any time any part of the route shall be graded, or the grade thereof changed or altered by the Board of Trustees, the bed of the road and the tracks thereof shall be made to conform therewith.

Provided, That no switch shall be constructed or maintained within fifty feet of any cross-street, and the location of such switches or turnouts shall be changed at the cost of the holders of this franchise, whenever so ordered by the Board of Trustees.

5. Said road shall be constructed under the direction and supervision of the City Engineer, who shall, under the direction of the Board of Trustees, designate the rate of curves to be used in surveying the lines of the road from one street to another, where it is necessary to change the direction of sidings or switches, and shall give the established grade of the streets along the line, and on the construction of said road shall set grade stakes along the line, indicating the grade of said street, and shall have general supervision of the construction and future maintenance of the road, and to see that the same is constructed and maintained in conformity to the terms and requirements of this ordinance. And for the services of the City Engineer, as herein required, he shall receive such fees as are customary for such services, and the same shall be paid by the holders of this franchise.

6. The rate of fare along said road shall at no

time exceed five cents for one passenger for any distance less than three miles, and shall at no time exceed ten cents for one passenger for any greater distance.

7. The owners of said road shall pay to the city of San Diego such license for each car as may be required by any ordinance of said city.

8. Said road shall be commenced within three months, and be fully completed, equipped, stocked and in running order within one year after the passage and publication of this ordinance. And the failure to comply with the terms of this condition shall work a forfeiture of all rights and privileges granted by this ordinance.

9. The rights hereby granted are to continue for a term of thirty years from and after the adoption of this ordinance.

The city in granting this franchise expressly reserves the right to grade, renew, sewer, pave, macadamize, improve, alter or repair all or either of said streets or any part thereof, or to lay down, or to permit any other person or company to lay down pipes for water, gas or other purposes, such work to be done so as to obstruct, or injure, said road as little as possible; the owners of said road shall shift and reshift their roadbed and

rails so as to avoid obstructions made thereby.

Any failure of said grantee or its assigns to construct, maintain or manage said road as required by this ordinance, or to comply with any of the requirements or conditions hereof, is hereby made unlawful, and for such failure and for any such failure or other violation of any of the requirements or conditions of this ordinance said grantees shall pay to the city of San Diego not less than \$25 nor more than \$300, to be recovered by an action in the name of said city.

It is further provided that said parties shall have the right to use steam upon said road as a motive power to transport freight and passengers.

When sheet piling is ordered by the engineer to be left in place, it will be paid for at its proper actual cost as an extra. No other lumber will be allowed for in the estimates.

Whenever water is encountered in trenching it is to be removed by contractor, who must provide such pumps, &c., as are necessary to keep water entirely away from pipes until the joints have set and are covered.

Such portions of the excavated earth as the engineer may indicate, in quality and quantity, shall be thrown to one side of the trench to be

used for covering the pipe. The remainder of the excavation will be thrown to the other side of the trench. Under no circumstances are stub or grade pegs to be disturbed or covered.

The trench must not be opened for more than 300 feet in advance of the pipe laying, nor left unfilled more than 100 feet in the rear of the pipe laying. Said work to be performed at the places and at the times as may be directed by the Board of Trustees.

The work must be carried on at such a rate of speed as to allow the pipe-laying gangs to be uninterrupted in their work. Any delay or overcrowding of these gangs is to be compensated for by such damages, to be paid by the contractor to the city, as the resident engineer may determine to be just.

The contractor must maintain barricades and lights to prevent accidents to passengers in the streets, and must take special precautions to secure the safety of buildings and property near the excavation.

All ordinances relating to such precautions and safeguards must be fully and faithfully observed by the contractor, he holding himself personally amenable for any violation of them by his employes or agents.

In ditching about water and gas pipes special care must be exercised, and if any injury is caused by the carelessness or neglect of any workman the cost of repair is to be deducted by the city from the compensation of the contractor, and should be by him deducted from the wages of such workman.

Back filling to a depth of one foot over the top of the pipe will be done by the pipe-laying gang.

The filling above this depth will be done by the contractor. The earth will be thoroughly rammed or rolled in layers to the satisfaction of the Board of Trustees and Superintendent of Streets.

In crossing streets, gutters, crosswalks and other places over which there is a great amount of travel, special attention will be given to making the filling compact, and when the engineer requires it a portion of the street will be planked.

As the work progresses, and at least as fast as the engineer shall direct, all surplus earth, material and rubbish shall be removed from the street by the contractor at his own expense.

All portions of the work shall be at all times subject to the control of the engineer or his representatives, and all their orders shall be promptly and completely executed.

Ten per cent of the compensation to be paid to the contractor under this agreement shall be retained for such time as the City Engineer shall determine, not exceeding three months from the completion of the work. If during this full period the contractor shall maintain the street in good condition over the filling, this retained money shall be paid to him on the certificate of the resident engineer.

Should the contractor at any time neglect for more than twenty-four hours to make good any defect in the filling, the resident engineer shall have authority to make the same good and to deduct the cost of so doing from the 10 per cent herein provided to be retained from the amount due the contractor.

The city engineer shall make a certified estimate at the end of each month of the length of trench excavated and completely refilled in exact compliance with these specifications during such month, and the contractor shall be paid the full compensation due therefor under this agreement, less the 10 per cent above provided to be retained.

An Ordinance establishing the grade of India street, from the south side of H Street to the south side of Kalmia street in the city San Diego, State of California.

THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE CITY of San Diego do ordain as follows:

SECTION 1. The grade of India street from the south side of H street to the south side of Kalmia street, is hereby established as follows:

The elevation of the points herein named above the datum line of levels fixed by Ordinance No. 3 shall be fixed as follows:

At the southwest corner of India and H streets, 1.0 feet; at the northwest corner thereof, 1.0 feet; at the southeast corner thereof, 1.0 feet; and at the northeast corner thereof, 1.5 feet.

At the southwest corner of India and G streets, 6.0 feet; at the northwest corner thereof, 6.5 feet; at the southeast corner thereof, 6.5 feet; and at the northeast corner thereof, 7.0 feet.

At the southwest corner of India and F streets, 7.0 feet; at the northwest corner thereof, 7.5 feet; at the southeast corner thereof, 8.0 feet; and at the northeast corner thereof, 8.5 feet.

At the southwest corner of India and E streets, 9.0 feet; at the northwest corner thereof, 9.5 feet; at the southeast corner thereof, 10.0 feet; and at the northeast corner thereof, 10.0 feet.

And the grade of said India street, between the points fixed by this Ordinance, shall be of uniform ascent or descent, as shown by the grade map made by the City Engineer and on file in his office.

The center of said street shall be eighteen inches higher than the average of the gutter grades.

SEC. 2. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

SEC. 3. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication as required by law.

THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE CITY of San Diego do ordain as follows: The San Diego Street Car Company, a corporation organized under the laws of the State of California, having heretofore obtained permission from this Board to construct and maintain a railroad upon Fifth street, and it being made to appear to this Board that the public good would be promoted by permitting the company to lay down and maintain upon said street a double track, constructed as hereinafter provided, the said corporation is hereby authorized to lay down and maintain a double track upon said Fifth street, from the water front to Upas street, for the time herebefore granted to them for the construction and maintenance of their said road, and subject to all the conditions and provisions heretofore made in an ordinance of this Board granting the original privilege to said corporation for laying a single track thereon, with the additional provisions following, to-wit: The said corporation shall take up and remove from said street the "T" rail single track now located on said Fifth street, and instead thereof, shall lay down in a good and substantial manner a double track thereon, each to be of equal distance, as near as practicable, from the center of said street, being sufficiently far apart to enable the free passage of cars; that said

tracks shall consist of a good flat rail, such as are usually used in the construction of street railroads; that said rails shall be placed upon a level with the grade of the street, and the ground between them and between the two tracks before referred to, shall be filled level with the top of said rails and at all times shall be kept filled up so as to maintain a uniform level street throughout; that when the said street shall be ordered paved by this Board, the said corporation shall pave all the spaces between the rails of their said tracks, and also the space between the two tracks laid as aforesaid, and two feet on each side on the outside of said tracks, all in the manner provided for the paving of said streets in the order directing the same, and at all times keep the same in good repair and condition, free of expense to said city; that the said work shall be done under the superintendence and direction of the City Engineer having charge of the work done upon the streets of said city for the time being, to his satisfaction, and subject to his acceptance when done.

The clerk of this Board shall cause this ordinance to be certified and published as required by law.
