San Diego Data Portal Now Online

San Diego's public open data portal is now online at <u>data.sandiego.gov</u>. But it's not just for nerds or

techies! The data provides new insight about how the City f unctions and gives both the public and software developers easy access to frequently-requested information such as solar panel permits issued, water quality or parking meter statistics.

Providing a public portal for data gives every citizen the opportunity to become more engaged while at the same time making our government smarter and more efficient. Our employees will have as much use for this as the public.

This is also a major step toward more government transparency. When I was first elected to Council, I sat down with local tech

entrepreneurs and developed the City's open data policy which was eventually adopted by the City Council in November 2014. The first 44 datasets are available with this release but many others will be added as time goes on and the data online now will be updated automatically, something that makes San Diego's data portal stand out from other municipal data portals. The City of San Diego Storefront Improvement Program gives San Diego businesses design assistance and financial incentives to help revitalize building facades. The Scripps Ranch Village Center on Scripps Ranch Blvd. recently qualified for a \$16,000 rebate through the program. Summer Water Safety

The San Diego Junior Lifeguard Foundation has partnered with Rady Children's Hospital to promote summer water safety. They recently launched the Water Watcher Tag campaign with the goal to reduce the

number of drownings and injuries related to near drownings. The campaign includes a tag with a whistle meant to be worn by an adult supervising children in the water.

You can pick up your FREE Water Watcher Tags at locations throughout the region including the Rancho Family YMCA in Rancho Peñasquitos at 9140 Fairgrove Lane, San Diego, CA 92129.

Keep a "Water Watcher" tag at your next pool party and assign a responsible adult to the important job, which includes:

- Keeping a constant eye on children in or near water
- Staying within arm's reach of children in water
- Avoiding distractions like texting on the phone
- Avoiding drinking alcohol before or during your Water Watcher time
