## San Diego Promise Zone | Overview



#### About the Promise Zone

In 2016, the San Diego Promise Zone became one of 22 federally designated Promise Zones in the United States and one of only four in California. The San Diego Promise Zone covers a 6.4-square-mile targeted area with more than 80,000 residents that spans East Village and Barrio Logan east to Encanto. It is home to the City's most culturally rich and ethnically diverse neighborhoods, but also some of the most under-resourced communities. Through the <u>Promise Zone initiative</u>, community-based organizations, direct service providers, residents, and business owners work with government agencies to enhance collective impact, streamline resources, and deliver comprehensive support.

Since 2016, the unemployment rate has decreased from 14.9% to 6.7%, and the poverty rate has fallen from 38.3% to now 22.1% (ACS, 2016, 2021). We recognize there are many factors that contribute to these numbers. We do know that in the 7 years since the designation, targeted efforts from the city and community-based organizations have supported some improvement in these areas, however, we recognize there is still plenty of work to do to continue improving the lives of our Promise Zone residents.

## **Economic Activity Working Group Highlight**

**Economic Activity** hosted a Business Walk in the Logan Height corridor along Imperial Avenue between 19th Street and 32nd Street on June 28th. A "Business Walk" is an afternoon dedicated to learning more about local businesses through face-to-face conversations, building relationships, and helping our Economic Development Department better serve small business owners. Local business leaders, government representatives, and partner organizations visited business owners with the intention of the following:

• Enhancing the working relationships between local government, Promise Zone community-based organizations, and local businesses

• Providing local businesses with educational resources; and

• Assisting the City of San Diego and community organizations in Logan Heights with the development of future initiatives to better serve the business community
