ARE YOU READY FOR SUMMER?

Beach and Water Safety

In an effort to avoid tragic accidents, San Diego lifeguards ask anyone coming to the beaches and coastal areas to consider the following safety guidelines:

- Learn to swim
- Swim near a lifeguard
- Never swim alone
- Supervise children closely, even when lifeguards are present
- Don't rely on flotation devices, such as rafts or inner-tubes. Even US Coast Guard approved life jackets are not a substitute for swimming ability

- If caught in a rip current, swim sideways until free, don't swim against the current's pull
 - Do not swim while under the influence of illicit drugs, medications that may cause impairment or alcohol
 - Protect your head, neck and spine -- don't dive into unfamiliar waters -- feet first, first time
- If you are in trouble, call or wave for help
 - Follow regulations and lifeguard directions
 - Swim parallel to shore if you wish to swim long distances





SHAKESPEARE'S FIRST FOLIO IN SAN DIEGO

Shakespeare will take center stage in San Diego this summer. The Old Globe and the San Diego Public Library were selected as the only stop in California for First Folio! The Book that Gave Us Shakespeare, on tour from the Folger Shakespeare Library, a national traveling exhibition to commemorate the 400th anniversary of William Shakespeare's death.

Shakespeare's First Folio, published in 1623, will be available for public viewing starting Saturday, June 4, in the Art Gallery on the ninth floor of the San Diego Central Library @ Joan A Irwin Jacobs Common, 330 Park Blvd. Accompanying the rare book will be a multi-panel exhibit exploring the significance of the Folio, along with original props, costumes, photographs and ephemera from The Old Globe theatre's archive.
