New Transit Center Opens in Sabre Springs

North County residents have more access to public transit with the opening of a new transit center in Sabre Springs/Rancho Penasquitos. Last week, I attended the ribbon cutting for the center which officially opened Monday, March 3. The new transit center, located at 13538 Sabre Springs Parkway

just south of Ted Williams Parkway, will serve the MTS Commuter Express Bus service. In summer 2014, Rapid bus services will connect customers along the I-15 corridor to Downtown San Diego and other employment centers. The routes also connect to those that go further north at Rancho Bernardo, Del Lago and Escondido.

The station has a total of 630 parking spaces with a "smart parking" structure, enhanced bus staging areas, new shelters, next bus arrival signs, electric vehicle charging stations, a photovoltaic system, fuel-efficient and clean-air vehicle spaces, security cameras, and a modular bicycle parking facility.

Community Profile: Eugene "Gene" Gomes

Scripps Ranch lost one of its earliest residents, Gene Gomes, when he passed away on Christmas Day 2013 due to congestive heart failure. For more than 30 years he delivered the SRCA Newsletter to his Red Rock Court neighbors, until his health no longer permitted it. It was a privilege to have the opportunity to recognize him by adjourning the February 24 City Council meeting in his honor.

Born on Nov. 14, 1927, Gene lived in Scripps Ranch for 43 years. He and his wife, Jayne—with their children, Mark and Anita—moved to Red Rock Court in 1970 when he retired from the Air Force.

One of the first 100 families to move into the brand new development, Gene and his family recalled there were no schools, no supermarket and one small conven-

ience store, "Little Bear." Many close friendships formed, and Gene participated in many community groups including Boy Scouts, the Miramar Ranch Elementary PTA and as a chef for the renowned "Huli Chicken" barbecue cooking events. He loved living in Scripps Ranch and will be missed.

Improving Exports in San Diego

I am proud to be part of a coalition of leaders working together to improve the exports and engage world markets. San Diego is poised for success because of our location on the Pacific Rim and U.S.-Mexico border but continues to under-perform when it comes to exporting. Improving exports would be transformative for our local economy. For every \$1 billion in new exports, 5,000 good paying jobs are created.

In partnership with the Port of San Diego, the San Diego Economic Development Corporation, CONNECT and several other partners, we recently released the "Global San Diego—Engaging World Markets" plan which addresses several ways we can increase our exports. Examples include improving market diversity among local companies already exporting, in addition to helping companies that are not currently exporting; addressing infrastructure deficiencies both at our border as well as cyber-infrastructure. Finally, educating small and medium businesses in San Diego on the opportunities and resources available to help them begin to export their products.
