Getting Personal About The Flu

Last influenza season was the deadliest in San Diego since the County began tracking the disease. This is more than just a statistic to me though, it's personal. Influenza claimed the life of my brother Brad Kersey in January. Brad was 37 years old and died from something that probably could have been prevented if he had gotten his flu shot. Even though there's no guarantee he wouldn't have gotten sick, I'm convinced he might have fared better if he had taken the few minutes to get the shot. That's why I am working this year to make sure more people know how easy and inexpensive it is to get a flu shot, in hopes that I will prevent even one family from having to suffer the way my family has. I hope you and your family will join me at one of two flu clinics being held in District Five this month in partnership with Palomar Health. If you can't make one of these, they are available at most pharmacies.

Increase in Sidewalk Repair Funding

Safe sidewalks are critical to our quality of life in San Diego. That's why I joined my Council colleagues in approving \$2.4 million for City sidewalk and streetlight improvements in the 2015 budget. As part of that funding, the City increased its contribution to the 50-50 Program, which splits



the cost of sidewalk repairs with residents. You may not realize but property owners are responsible for the sidewalk in front of their home or business. The added funding means the City will now pay 75 percent of repair costs while the property owner pays 25 percent.

I urge residents to take advantage of the program. And let me know if you see a sidewalk in need of repair by contacting my office or submitting a service request online at <u>http://apps.sandiego.gov/streetdiv/</u>.

Also, as an update, the City's first-ever sidewalk assessment is moving along and crews were recently in Rancho Bernardo. They will be in other District Five communities throughout the rest of the year. When completed, we will finally have a record of any sidewalk which is damaged, lifted or otherwise in disrepair so we can move forward on a plan to fix them.

Military Economic Impact in San Diego Tops \$38B

San Diego has a long history as a military town. Not only is the military culture and history intertwined with the region, it is also important to our regional economy. The San Diego Military Advisory Council released its annual economic impact report last month and found the military's economic impact to the region for Fiscal Year 2014 topped \$38 billion. I've voiced my concerns to our federal representatives that any drastic cuts to defense would have a serious trickle-down effect on San Diego's economy.
