
Upgrades Coming to Rancho Bernardo Rec Center

The gym at the Rancho Bernardo Glassman Recreation Center has long been in need of repairs, like so many of our community buildings throughout the City. I am happy to announce that I've authorized \$5,000 from the District Five Community Projects, Programs and Services Fund to be transferred to Parks and Recreation to make some critical repairs to the gym. The gym serves more than 250 people each day, hosting a youth basketball league, pickle ball (pictured) and hours of open gym time for the public.

The repairs include installing new cable and padding on all of the basketball backboards; installing new safety straps on all of the basketball structures; and repairing the hoop and its mechanical winching control in the side court. Repairs will also be made to the gym bleachers so they will finally be in good working condition for the many families who come to watch their children compete. Repairs are set to occur this spring. Center Director Berenice Mora says gym users will not be impacted when the repairs are made.



Street Repairs Ramping Up



You may have seen the City's Pothole Repair Crew working on both Poway Road and Rancho Penasquitos Blvd. last month. They'll be back in District Five again on February 11 and February 25 so please report any potholes you see to me or submit it online via the link on my City website at <http://www.sandiego.gov/citycouncil/cd5/>. Related to road repairs, in the State of the City address last month, Mayor Faulconer committed to repaving 1,000 miles of San Diego roads over the next five years. That's more than one third of all our streets. I will continue to advocate for additional funds and streets in District Five.



Crime Prevention Tips from SDPD

In January, we were informed of a string of burglaries in the Carmel Mountain/Sabre Springs area. According to Police, burglary is mostly a crime of opportunity. They've asked me to share a few crime prevention tips to keep in mind so you can prevent your home from becoming a target.

- Lock your doors, windows and close your garage when you are away from home
- When you are out of town, set a timer to turn on lights and even the television when you would normally have them on. Have outdoor lights set with a motion detector.
- Tell a trusted neighbor when you are out of town so they can keep an eye on your home for anything suspicious.
- Put a temporary hold on your newspaper and mail. Leaving those piled up is a tell tale sign that no one is home.
