# **Rancho Peñasquitos Library Gets New Roof, HVAC**

I am happy to report that the Rancho Peñasquitos Library now has a new roof and heating and air conditioning system. The project had been listed as a top priority by the Rancho Peñasquitos Planning Board. Construction was completed on May 4-5 and the library reopened on May 6. The renovations cost approximately \$1.4 million.

Our public libraries are a valuable community asset, providing learning opportunities for our youth and a gathering place for all citizens. I am so glad to see the library finally getting the attention it deserves so our residents will have a more comfortable environment for learning and reading.

Thank you to the community for your patience during the brief closure for construction and I look forward to seeing everyone enjoy the more comfortable library.



### **Bernardo Fire Anniversary Reminder to Prepare**



Last May, our region was struck by major wildfires including the Bernardo Fire in Black Mountain Ranch. As we approach the one year anniversary of the fire, I ask that you take stock of your emergency preparations. If you don't have an emergency kit and evacuation plan, I urge you to look to the Scripps Ranch Fire Safe Council at www.srfiresafecouncil.org. They recently released an emergency evacuation plan for the Scripps Ranch community but it contains really helpful information for all communities as well. Additionally, please reevaluate your property to ensure your home has the required 100 foot buffer zone of defensible space.

Also, the American Red Cross released a new smart phone app

which provides real time weather alerts and safety information. The Red Cross Emergency App is available on the iTunes App Store and Google Play.



# **Poway Road Bike Path Complete**

Construction on the Poway Road Bike Path is now complete. The new path just east of I-15 connects the existing bike path to the west, along the southeast intersection of I-15 and Poway Road, to the bike route on Poway Road east of Sabre Springs Parkway. The new 1,800 foot Class I bike path is protected by a barrier separating it from vehicles on the road.

While more people have the chance to use this alternative form of transportation, vehicle drivers must be more vigilante and drive with care. Bicycles in the roadways are considered vehicles, only they are much more vulnerable in an accident. SDPD Northeastern Division Capt. Dawn Summers provided the following



tips for drivers about how to safely coexist with bicycles on the road:

- Always use your turn signal
- Exercise the same caution as you would for an approaching vehicle
- California law requires all vehicles give bicycles three feet of space when passing a cyclist on the road
- Yield to cyclists at intersections

# **Proposed FY16 Budget Good for District Five**

During the first week of May, the City Council reviewed the Mayor's proposed Fiscal Year 2016 budget. There are a lot of positive things for District Five can look forward to when the budget goes into effect on July 1. I've highlighted a few below:

### **Increased Recreation Center Hours**

Scripps Ranch Recreation Center and Rancho Bernardo Glassman Recreation Center will both have hours extended from the current 45 hours per week to 60 hours per week.

### **Repairs to Carmel Mountain Ranch Community Park**

The playground at Carmel Mountain Ranch Community Park is slated for repairs.

### Library Internet Speeds Tripling

All branch libraries will be getting upgraded internet service, tripling the current internet speed including Scripps Miramar Ranch, Rancho Peñasquitos, Rancho Bernardo and Carmel Mountain Ranch.

### **Do Your Homework at the Library Program Expansion**

Scripps Miramar Ranch Library will see an expansion of the "Do Your Homework at the Library" program. The program is set to be extended through the summer to accommodate year-round schools and better serve students and parents.

### 300 Miles of Street Repairs Slated Citywide

Streets citywide will be getting major repairs in fiscal year 2016. The list of streets won't be available until after the construction contracts are completed but we will keep you apprised of exact streets in our District Five communities.
