First Mile On the Way to 1,000

Earlier this year, I joined Mayor Faulconer when he announced his goal of repaving 1,000 miles of San Diego streets over the next five years. Well, they say a journey begins with a single step and on Monday we took the first step toward that 1,000 mile goal by repaving the first mile. The first mile was on Rio San



Diego Drive in Mission Valley but over the next five years streets city-wide will be seeing repairs. Among them, Scripps Ranch Blvd. just east of Carrol Canyon Road, which is scheduled to be repaved later this year. Approximately 300 miles are budgeted for repairs in the fiscal year that began July 1. Overall, one third of City streets will see major repairs by 2020.

This is a major milestone in our efforts to rebuild San Diego. As chair of the Infrastructure Committee, I continue to advocate on behalf of neighborhood repairs. From streets to sidewalks and libraries to fire stations, we are investing more in infrastructure than ever before. Half of all new general fund revenue is going to infrastructure, we've hired more

staff to work on projects and we are streamlining city processes to help "repair our repair program." The decades of neglect in our neighborhoods stops now.

Rancho Bernardo Welcome Sign Unveiled

The entrance to Rancho Bernardo is now a lot more welcoming. I joined community members to unveil the new community identification sign last month. The completed sign is located in the median at Rancho Bernardo Road and Bernardo Center Drive, near the New Mercado shopping center. It was designed in

partnership with the community and construction was completed by Miramar Sign. The sign has two stone columns on either side of the painted concrete featuring the traditional Rancho Bernardo logo.

You may have noticed the grass median where the sign is located is brown which can't be watered due to current restrictions. I am looking into replacing the grass with new drought tolerant landscaping. Hope to have an update on that for you in the near future.

Edgewave Receives MetroConnect Prize

Rancho Bernardo-based cyber security company Edgewave is one of 15 local companies to receive the MetroConnect Prize. Managed by San Diego Regional Economic Development Corporation, and presented

by JPMorgan Chase, the MetroConnect Prize grants 15 San Diego small and medium sized companies \$10,000 each in order to assist with developing international business opportunities. The MetroConnect Prize is part of the Go Global San Diego Initiative, which aims to help San Diego maximize its economic competitiveness and prosperity through increased global engagement.

Edgewave is a cyber security company that employs 65 people. The company currently derives 10 percent of its revenue from foreign sources. As a MetroConnect Prize recipient, Edgewave plans to spend the funds to further develop markets in Manila, Philippines and Shanghai, China. Mike Wall, managing director of security operations & Analysis was one of only two winning companies to



have the opportunity to speak at the press conference on July 1. It was wonderful to see a company from District Five receive such an honor and they are now eligible to receive the MetroConnect Grand Prize of \$50,000. District Five Community Profile: Innovator Raj Sanghvi, Rancho Bernardo



Rancho Bernardo resident Raj Sanghvi was the grand prize winner of Plantronics PLT Labs Application Innovation Contest. His "PlanetCar" mobile app beat out thousands of entries from more than 30 countries.

PlanetCar is described as a "a cross-platform mobile app which leverages data gleaned from several of the nine-axis sensors in Plantronics' Wearable Concept 1 prototype device, to raise an alert when a collision event is detected (i.e. accident). The goal is to help first responders reduce the time required to reach the site of an emergency."

Sanghvi is CEO and technical architect at Bitcot, Inc., a technology driven mobile cloud software development company located in Rancho Bernardo.

BitCot Inc. is the premier technology development partner secured by hardware companies (Bluetooth LE) in rolling out new app developments and upgrades in the mobile Apps hi-tech field. Previously, Sanghvi was a senior eCommerce Architect with Sony Electronics.
