Did you know District Five is home to one of San Diego's great coffee roasters? Started in 2013, Mostra Coffee is located in the Rancho Bernardo/Carmel Mountain Ranch area. While serving primarily as their main roasting warehouse, Mostra Coffee turns into a mini-coffee house on Wednesdays and Saturdays from 9 a.m.-2 p.m. They serve everything from single-origin pour overs, specialty and traditional espresso drinks to an array of cold brew coffee drinks.

Mostra Coffee also hosts regular cupping sessions where customers can learn about the roasting and brewing processes, while tasting many of their offerings.

The events are a great way to teach the practical skill of fixing broken items instead of throwing them in our landfills. Residents of all ages can learn the value of tinkering and becoming Do-It-Yourselfers while learning the importance of recycling.

Possible items include electronics, appliances, computers, toys, bicycles or clothes. The library will provide a workspace, specialty tools and guidance to help you disassemble and troubleshoot your item. Whether it gets fixed or not, you'll learn more about how it was manufactured and how it worked.

One of the main components of the Pure Water San Diego education and outreach program is tours of the Advanced Water Purification (AWP) Facility. To date, more than 8,500 people have toured, and attendees have included students of all ages, from grade school through medical school. Younger Girl Scout troops (Brownies) are some of the most frequent youth visitors. Brownies participate in the AWP Facility tours to fulfill part of the requirements for their Wonders of Water Journey patch, which tasks them with learning about water's importance in the world.




