# La Jolla Business Walk

On **Dec. 5, 2018** and **Jan. 25, 2019**, the Economic Development Department held its La Jolla Business Walk, covering one of the City's largest Business Improvement District, with more than 1,100 non-home-based businesses in a 0.3-square-mile area.

Prior to Dec. 5, 2018, Economic Development Department staff canvassed the walk area and personally delivered postcards (right) announcing the upcoming walk. The back of the postcards provided City resource information.

Despite the inclement weather on the afternoon of Dec. 5, volunteers, including Economic Development Department staff, **District 1 Councilmember Barbara Bry** and several staff members and a strong contingent from the **La Jolla Village Merchants Association**; visited businesses in 12 of the 31 walk districts. Due to weather, Day 2 of the walk was postposed until Jan. 25, 2019. Volunteers covered the remaining 19 districts, engaged business owners and had many of them complete a seven-question survey about the business climate and the benefits and challenges of doing business in La Jolla.

- Volunteers: 25 (Volunteers represented the City's Economic Development Department, Council District 1, the La Jolla Village Merchants Association and the local community.)
- Number of Businesses Visited: 366
- Number of Surveys Completed: 115





## La Jolla Business Walk Survey Results

Of the 366 businesses visited, 115 businesses (31 percent) completed surveys.

#### **Doing Business**

## 65% Favorable

Of the 113 respondents, 73 rated La Jolla as an "Excellent" or "Good" place to do business.

#### **Business Climate Outlook**

### 55% Positive

Of the 111 respondents, 61 said they are "Very Optimistic" or "Optimistic" about the business climate in La Jolla.

"Neutral" respondents (41) cited:

- Not enough parking •
- High rent •
- Too much traffic, getting to and around La Jolla

## Safe Community

The seaside community known for its arts, culture, fine dining, cozy eateries, high-end retail as well as professional services (legal, finance, etc.) has a lot going for it. Responding business owners said they most benefited from La Jolla's safety and cleanliness. Also, its walkability and good foot traffic were big positives for stores clustered together.
