


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### Charette

- What is a Charrette?
  - ▶ A charette is an planning technique for consulting with all community stakeholders. Charrettes are typically multi-day meetings involving city officials, developers, and local residents.



▶ A charrette promotes joint ownership of the solution and allows for the public to provide input early on in the planning process.
