## Amendments to the Land Development Code ESL Regulations – Wetland Deviations

#### Introduction

- ESL adopted to assure protection of resources consistent with conservation principles and private property rights
- Impacts to resources allowed only through a Site Development Permit (SDP) consistent with findings as specified in LDC Section 126.0504 (a) (b) (c)

## Findings

Overall, project must be designed to avoid wetland impacts to the maximum extent practicable; the findings to allow for a deviation from the regulations are:

- No feasible measures to further minimize potential adverse impacts on ESL
- Proposal is minimum necessary to afford relief from special circumstances



## **Existing LDC**

Currently limited guidance provided to staff, applicant and decision maker regarding:

- Evaluation of impacts
- Under what circumstances deviations should be considered and approved



#### **City Council Direction - History**

- Asked staff to identify in what development situations wetland impacts may be considered and to develop criteria and analysis to assist in evaluation and decision making
- Established working group(s) comprised of environmental organizations, development community and city staff



## **Working Groups**

- Met over a several year period to address task
- Presented unresolved issues to LU&H with respect to :
  - Definition of an Essential Public Project
  - Use of the Economic Viability Option
  - Mitigation ratios for biologically superior projects



## Land Use and Housing

In March 2004, LU&H directed staff to:

- Develop a list of Essential Public Projects
- Develop a definition of Essential Public Project
- Require double mitigation for biologically superior projects
  - Complete the environmental review process before proceeding to City Council



#### Draft LDC and Bio Guidelines Amendments

City's alternative, the project, evolved based upon:

- LU&H direction
- Wildlife Agencies comments
- Amount of time elapsed between committee direction and final preparation of draft amendments and environmental documentation.



## **General Project Description**

- Clarify when impacts to wetlands <u>outside</u> of the Coastal Zone may be requested with SDP
- LDC amendments establishes <u>the only</u> <u>three project scenarios</u> that may be considered for deviations from the wetland regulations
- Land Development Manual Biology Guidelines provide direction to staff and applicant on impact analysis for each of the three project types and mitigation requirements



#### Draft Amendment Language - ESL

Section 143.0110 and 143.0101 -Development regulations for Sensitive Biological Resources

 Minor revisions for clarification and rearrangement of existing language

Section 143.0150 – Deviations from Environmentally Sensitive Lands Regulations

Establishes the three categories for which deviations from wetland regulations may be requested through an SDP



## **Deviation Categories - EPP**

Essential Public Projects (EPP) -

- Projects identified in an adopted land use plan <u>and</u> identified on the Essential Public Projects List adopted by CC resolution and included as an appendix to the LDM – Bio Guidelines
- Linear Infrastructure
  Maintenance of public infrastructure
  State and federally mandated projects



## **Economic Viability**

- Deviation may be requested to preserve an economically viable USE
- Minimum necessary to achieve use and shall avoid impacts to the maximum extent practicable



## **Biologically Superior**

- Deviation may be requested to implement a superior biological result- provides a net increase in quality and viability
- Impacted resources shall be demonstrated to be of low biological quality



#### Land Development Manual – Biology Guidelines

- Minor revisions and reorganization of information
- Provides direction for impact analysis for each of the options, including survey protocols
- Establishes (consistent with draft LDC language) the three development scenarios for which a deviation from the wetland regs may be requested



# LDM – Biology Guidelines

- Establishes criteria for Essential Public Projects
- Provides detailed and consistent direction on preparation of economic viability analysis
- Provides direction regarding determination of biological quality of wetland types



# LDM – Biology Guidelines

- Requires and defines procedure for obtaining concurrence from resource agencies
- Defines two alternatives within the Biologically Superior Option and establishes two sets of mitigation ratios
- Wetland Buffer based upon functions and values (same as existing requirement). If analysis not provided, defaults to 100-foot buffer



## **LDM- Biology Guidelines**

- San Diego fairy shrimp
- No project exemptions or specific pipeline provision
- Long Term Management lands dedicated to the City of San Diego must be accompanied by funding for any in perpetuity management and monitoring required as part of a project's state and federal permits

- Definition of Essential Public Project Option
- Economic Viability Option mitigation requirements
- Factors for determining wetland quality
- Wildlife Agencies Review Requirements
- Working group provides for specific project exemptions
   Wetland Buffer Requirements
