## 1. Call to Order / Roll Call

Brooke Peterson called the meeting to order at 6:35 p.m. Attendance called by Jeff Barfield and quorum present.

## 2. Non-Agenda Public Comment

Public:

Martin Wilson passed out proposed plans for improvements to his shopping center on Mt. Alifan. Jack Carpenter asked about Fire Marshal approval and about fire access. Mr. Wilson indicated he has approval from Bob Medan, Fire Safety Officer for the City. Jeff Barfield suggested the project review sub-committee should review the project first before bringing it to the CMPC as an action item. Brooke Peterson agreed. Mr. Wilson indicated he would make arrangements to meet with the sub-committee. No further action was taken.

Committee Members:

Scott Wentworth announced that Clairemont Family Day is Saturday, August 2 at the South Clairemont Recreation Center. Dot Jensen handed out fliers.

## 6. Action Items

#### 201. T-Mobile Brillo ROW Project (Amanda Nations, Parsons)

Ms. Nations introduced the proposed tower for wireless com facility, 30-feet tower at the nw corner of Baxter and Brillo. Has 3 panel antennas enclosed within a radome. Purpose for tower is improved coverage for this area that has poor coverage, dropped calls, poor broadband service.

Jim Kennedy added comment about how they site their facilities. Try to avoid residential areas and try to get institutional properties such as churches or commercial opportunities. On this project, they spent almost one year as those types of sites did not meet coverage needs. They then go to residential sites or ROW. They utilized the City's permit process for wireless facilities. Don Steele asked if they have renderings of the facility when fully out fitted. Ms Nations commented it was on a street light pole. Equipment will be in the parkway and designed in conformance with city standards. Don asked about safety hazard with someone running stop sign and hitting pole. Ms. Nations asked about

Susan Mournian asked about how many others are in the city are in the public ROW. Jim Kennedy did not have the number but indicated they are others. Susan asked about what findings need to be made to deny or approve the application. Ms. Nations and Mr. Kennedy explained the code provisions are guided by city and state law and review is required and consideration for health and safety and community design standards.

Richard had questions about the size if the vault. Nations responded it is 5X 7, 8 feet deep. Kennedy responded with more detail about code and vaulting requirements. Richard also asked about cooling. Nations responded that they are cooled and that cooling equipment must meet noise requirements. Power will be placed underground.

Jack Carpenter asked about compensation afforded to property owners. Kennedy stated that an adjacent property owner inquired about having it on his property, that way he would at least be compensated. They elected not to because the city asks if they have any ROW locations available. Also, line of site concerns also important and 1 story single family home doesn't have height.

Richard Jensen asked about how they pay the city.

#### Public

Leo Lynn had three questions. Why exclude school site and aren't they paying fee, and how many companies. Also, visual pollution is a concern. Nations responded they avoid schools due to sensitivity issues. Nations reiterated no fees are paid for ROW sites. Commercial sites yes, but there aren't any comm. sites available. She indicated she did not believe it will be collocated with other carriers. Not tall enough. She indicated she is using a typical light standard.

Robert Ross, 28 year living in this house. He opposes it for 4 re4asons – eye sore. This will reduce the value of homes. The study is faulty. He has full reception in the area, 4 bars. The facility is not needed. Lastly, it is a new technology, and long studies have not been done- could be a health issue, and wants to error on the side of safety.

Elaine Bradley- questioned the statement that commercial was already looked at. One block away there is a tower, why can't it be used. Nations indicated that tower covers the area to the south, not this area. For shadowing and topographic reasons, that pole can not be used for the coverage area desired. Elaine asked about the canyon, Nations responded it doesn't provide coverage. Kennedy added that zone height limit of 30 feet limits where they can put it to get coverage.

Elleene Burqez asked how many in the Clairemont area are built in residential areas. Nations responded none. She added the energy will meet approved standards. Burqez asked if notices will be sent to homeowners.

Leslie Hunneker commended that staff is recommending disapproval pursuant to Council Policy. She feels it is not appropriate in this area.

Marilyn Strong, 43 year resident of Clairemont. She asked if there are others along Clairemont Mesa Blvd. Nations answered there are 3. Strong asked if they have the barbed wire and bricks (walls) surrounding them. Nations guaranteed it would not have barbed wire. Strong indicated it is an eye sore with poles out many windows.

Michael Depino commented that skateboarders live in the area and the meters will be used at a skateboard ramp. He stated its perfect for skateboarding. Little kids will explore and climb on it, fears kids will be hurt. He stated there is 50 thousand square feet of upper playfield on the school that could be used. It would be safer there than where they would walk by everyday. Nations responded schools are discouraged by council policy.

Dan Logg stated the tower doesn't fit in the residential neighborhood. He fears it will open u p a dam of requests to put these up, lowering property values. A study shows it reduces values by 20%. Feels zoning appropriately separates land uses that conflict and should be separated. Neighbors don't want commercial facility in residential.

Mike Acquira is opposed and passed some photos for the CMPC to view. Home is almost paid off, works as a carpenter trying to add value to peoples homes, doesn't

Leo Lynn asked question about an existing tower in the area on Balboa (Burger King) seems to be having things added to them. Asked if this could happen, Nations said that commercial towers permitted previously may get added to. This tower could not be added to without going through permit process because it is in a residential area.

Elenor Gaddy is a 50 year resident, doesn't want the tower.

Robert Ross stated some residents thought this meeting was next week.

Susan Mournian stated she felt the tower is being mis-characterized as a public utility. It is a private company. She said she will never support this tower until it is proven the school alternative is not a valid option. Kennedy added they are a quasi public just as the telephone company is.

Jack Carpenter asked if their technology is different from other carriers.

Motion by Don Steel to recommend rejection of the proposal, seconded by Susan Mournian **Vote 9-1-0** 

#### **202.** Balboa Mesa Center (Martin Wilson)

Mr. Wilson summarized the proposal. Currently 20,200 sf of bldg. Specialty market is 4,800 sf, With the addition 4000 feet, gets it to 9,000 sf. No liquor sales proposed. It is expanding the market. They are proposing covering the parking spaces – vehicles would be covered.

Don Steele commented it is a very successful business, difficult to park there. Felt the carports will help the parking. He asked about a tree in a tree well. He suggested it be moved to get better traffic flow. He suggested he use a middle-eastern theme to help market the shopping center.

Jack commented that most commercial area have their deliveries in the back. He wondered if this proposal would lead the areas to use the parking as staging areas for product. Mr. Wilson responded that the businesses aren't of the character to require storage- the requests have been for parking.

Susan Mournian complimented the market owner for a very clean and well run business.

Scott Wentworth commented renters would place plywood between stalls making it a place to hide. Prefers garages. Mr. Wilson stated he would put garages.

Jeff Barfield asked the width of the driveway, Wilson answered 26, with 19 feet of parking. Motion by Don Steele to approve, seconded by Scott Wentworth to recommend approval of the project.

Discussion centered on garages versus carports.

Motion amended by Don Steele to recommend it go to garages, seconded by Jack Carpenter **Vote: 9-1-0, motion passes.** 

#### 203. North City Prevention Coalition (CMPC Chair)

Scott Wentworth made a motion to approve the letter, Don Steele seconded.

Thomas Schmidt questioned last two sentences. He indicated he didn't think they make sense and there was no data presented to support the statements.

Richard Jensen does not support, too much regulation
