Minutes for Greater Golden Hill Planning Committee (GGHPC) 6/10/15 at the Balboa Park Golf Course Clubhouse

Meeting called to order at 6:30 pm by the Chair.

1. Additions and/or Deletions to Agenda. None.

2. Approval of Minutes. Santini moved, Strickland seconded. Motion carried 6-0, with Alvarez abstaining and Swarens not participating in vote. Alvarez will post on City website.

3. Governmental Reports.

--Community Policy Officer Kevin Vasquez. Not present.

--39th Senate District (Joyce Temporal for State Senator Block). Newsletter distributed with oral update.

--53rd Congressional District (Lee Steuer for Susan Davis). Not present

--City Council District 3 (Molly Chase for Todd Gloria): Newsletter distributed, & following comments

*Lots of noise complaints in area near Whistlestop, so enforcement has stepped up.

* FY 16 City budget has been approved

*A meeting about the 94 freeway cap park is set for June 17. Alvarez and Burkhart are on the working group.

*25th Street Renaissance work is due to be completed in July

*There will be community outreach about the configuration of the future multimodal pedestrian/bike path on Golf Course Drive

*Enforcement will be notified about needles in pocket park at Dale & A Streets;

*Concerns about illegal dumping/trash pickup were noted;

*It is requested that street repair contractors post notices of closures;

*Adjacent landowners should be notified of work so landscaping is not ripped up:

*Deco park locations still leave something to be desired, and sites should be reevaluated. Alvarez may place this on future agenda. *Fountain restoration in Golden Hill portion of Balboa Park should be completed by the 20th.

4. Chair, Vice Chair & CPC Reports.

--Chair:

*Alvarez anticipates a special meeting on the Target plan for Monday, June 22.

*ADA compliance. The Chair has consulted with City disability compliance staff and determined that the notice at the bottom of GGHPC agendas constitutes sufficient compliance.

--CPC: Alternate Brierton attended last month's meeting and e-mailed a brief report to GGHPC members. CPC minutes are available online.

5. Non-agenda Public Comments

--Valentina Molteni expressed opposition to the CalTrans SR 94 project (opposed by GGHPC several years ago). Materials were distributed. See http:<u>tinyurl.com/transit1st</u>. Alvarez stated this would be on the GGHPC agenda again when the Environmental Review comes out, possibly in July.

--Gerry Ray reported less noise in recent months and improved street sweeping.

--Jenny Gardner requested information about neighborhood watch programs/statistics.

--Robert Barnes expressed concern about crime, plus need for traffic, noise,

wastewater and parking enforcement

--Matthew Settles raised issues about collecting funds via trash enforcement and T-shirt logos.

6. Consent agenda. None.

7. Action items.

--Airport Noise Advisory Committee. Swarens cannot attend the July meeting. Alvarez moved, Strickland seconded: To designated Brierton, Santini and Sims as alternates. Motion carried, unanimous.

--Verizon Wireless Antenna at 19th and E Streets. (Morgan Chee, M&M Telecom). Handout provided.

Chee addressed actions/comments in response to issues raised by GGHPC at last month';s meeting. Concerns remained about undergrounding, view corridor esthetics, lack of City lease, maintenance of proposed vegetation.

Brierton moved, Diminico seconded: That this project be placed in abeyance until the City develops a lease for its right of way. Motion failed, 1-yes, 6-no, 1-abstain.

Alvarez moved, Strickland seconded: That GGHPC does not support this project. Motion carried, 7-yes, 1-no, 0-abstention.

--Sprint Wireless project at 766-28th Street. (Presented by Joanne Aguzar). Request to extend existing project.

Brierton moved, Sims seconded. Approve project. Motion carried, unanimous.

--GGHPC Operating funds.

Alvarez moved, Brierton seconded. GGHPC agrees to spend up to \$500 on website

development, maintenance and hosting; acquiring portable lighting; and further advertisement of GGHPC presence and purpose. Motion carried, unanimous.

--Victoria Curran expressed desire for dedicated bike lanes, not just sharrows
