- 1. **Call to Order/Introduction of Members:** The meeting was called to order at 6:31 p.m. by Chair Albert Velasquez, at the Otay Mesa Nestor Branch Library. He welcomed all Board members and members of the community to the meeting of the Otay Mesa-Nestor Community Planning Group (OMNCPG).

  - a. San Diego Police Chief Shelley Zimerman was in attendance, and gave the following report:
    - 1. She said that crime statistics are important, but do you feel safe in your neighborhood?
    - 2. The SDPD is staffed at about 140 officers less than needed, they want 2,100 total officers on staff.
      - a. San Diego is a 340 square mile city, 1.3 million people to protect and serve.
      - b. Retention and recruiting is a big push for the SDPD right now.
      - c. Retirement of 400 officers is approaching.
      - d. One-half of patrol officers have 6 or fewer years of experience in the Department.
    - 3. Employee development and training very important now.
      - a. There is an emerging crime statistic related to the Internet.
      - b. Crime can reach out internationally.
      - c. Young children can be in a room alone with a computer.

- 5. She said that there are 130 distinct and separate neighborhoods in the City of San Diego.
- 6. Non-emergency calls to 619-531-200 take 5-10 minutes to get through.
